Fellow Rotarian, Shannon Sanders-Welzien joined us on Monday and discussed the amazing adventures that the YWCA is taking on through the Empowerment Center. The YWCA is the state's designated "general homeless provider" for Clinton and Jackson counties. The Empowerment Center is focused on helping the community thrive. They work hard to service our community by providing housing support, financial assistance, and case management services to people experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homeless.

The Empowerment Center serves our community through the following programs:

- Emergency Shelter
- Rapid Rehousing for people experiencing literal homeless
- Permanent Supportive Housing for people experiencing chronic homelessness
- Homeless Prevention for those who are at-risk
- · Street Outreach
- · Case Management
- Coordinated Entry, which at one time was called "Homeless Outline," but it allows agencies to quickly identify, assess, refer, and connect people to housing and community assistance based on their strengths

One in every three in Clinton county (37%) are at or near poverty level. This is called "Alice" -- Asset Limited, Income Constrained, and Employed. The Empowerment Center uses the Housing First Model, which is an evidence based model that states people need a place to live before they can tackle other needs, such as a job, learning how to budget properly, or attending to substance use issues.

Rapid Rehousing, Permanent Supportive Housing, and Homelessness Prevention serves families, women, and men. Prevention dollars are for families and individuals that have housing but are at risk of losing it within 14 days. Rapid rehousing resources for up to 12 months, homeless prevention assistance are up to six months, permanent supportive housing is based on client needs, with no time limits. And all services have on-going case management and supportive advocacy.
