The History of the Rotary Bell

In 1922, U.S. Rotarians organized an attendance contest; the challenge was that the losing clubs would join in giving the winning club a prize. The Rotary Club of New York City was declared the winner and to them was awarded as a prize a bell from a popular patrol boat, which was placed on wood that came from HMS "Victory", Admiral Nelson's vessel at the battle of Trafalgar. Since then, the bell used in Rotary meetings started to represent, as on the ships, order, discipline and the time to guide us through the weekly hour and a half meetings. The bell informs us with its sound the beginning of the Rotary meeting, at which time people present should stand, same as at the end, in order to salute the national and Rotary flags. The gavel symbolizes the authority invested in the Rotarian elected to the highest position in Rotary, and through him/her reminds those present of his/her authority. When presidents transmit their positions to their successors at the end of their mandate, they give the bell their last hit turning the gavel over to their successor, symbolizing the transfer of authority.

FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 2 OF RI'S MONTH OF YOUTH SERVICE.

DRIVING THROUGH THE LUSH GREEN FIELDS IN THE VILLAGES OF KRISHNAGIRI, ABOUT 270KM FROM CHENNAI, IT IS DIFFICULT TO IMAGINE THAT ONLY A FEW YEARS AGO, THESE WERE BARREN PATCHES, WHERE THE FARMERS WERE STRUGGLING WITH INSUFFICIENT WATER TO RAISE THEIR CROPS. BUT TODAY, THANKS TO A GLOBAL GRANT PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN RC MADRAS COROMANDEL, RID 3232, RC STAVANGER INTERNATIONAL, NORWAY, AND TRF, THIS IS A VERDANT OASIS WITH LUSH PADDY FIELDS NOURISHED BY ABUNDANT WATER RESOURCES. THIS PARTNERSHIP HAS RESULTED IN A WATERSHED AND INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT IN THESE VILLAGES WITH HELP FROM NABARD (NATIONAL BANK OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT) AND NAF (NATIONAL AGRO FOUNDATION).

THE TOTAL GRANT VALUE WAS ₹1.25 CRORE (\$189,142) AND NABARD'S CONTRIBUTION WAS ₹1.15 CRORE. IT HAS BENEFITTED 15,000 VILLAGERS IN ABOUT 2,800 HOUSEHOLDS, SAYS PROJECT CHAIRMAN G BALASUBRAHMANIAM (BALA). THE WATERSHED WORK INCLUDED TWO MASONRY CHECK DAMS, 21 LOOSE BOULDER CHECK DAMS, 6,000 SUNKEN AND PERCOLATION PONDS, 4,300 FARM PONDS AND 1,000 WATER ABSORPTION TRENCHES. OVER 10,000 TREES WERE PLANTED TO PREVENT SOIL EROSION. THIS AREA HAS NOW BECOME A SYMBOL OF HOPE, OVERFLOWING WITH LIFE AND VITALITY. IT IS A TESTAMENT TO WHAT CAN BE ACHIEVED WHEN PEOPLE COME TOGETHER AND WORK TOWARDS A COMMON GOAL.
