WEBSITE: <u>IA NICE</u>

Angela Boelens with Iowa Nice presented to our club on Monday. Boelens visited us last year and discussed Iowa Nice. Boelen is the founder and president of IA NICE (Iowa Newcomer Integration Community & Exchange), a non-profit agency supporting Ukrainian refugee families seeking humanitarian parole with resettlement and integration into local Iowa communities. IA NICE, a 501c3, also provides guidance and necessary resources to community members and sponsors as they support newcomer families in rebuilding their lives in Iowa. Boelens lives in DeWitt, Iowa, and is a professor in the business administration department at Augustana College.

Boelens gave us a brief explanation of the conflict and how it started, back in 2014, with the covert invasion of the Ukrainian Republic of Crimea by Russians and local proxy forces. With little disruption from the international community, Russia seized territory in Ukraine's Donbas region. Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine began on February 24, 2022, when Russia's forces crossed the border into Ukraine and began attacking locations across the country.


Boelens described how IA Nice was formed, from her initial idea to receiving funding from 21 investors who were willing to invest \$20,000 each, for a little over \$400,000. Their intent is to help successfully sponsored and assist Ukrainian refugee families [newcomers] with entry into the United States and integration into our beautiful state. The committee stands ready to subsidize the newcomers for up to 120 days. "All of them so far have become self-sufficient by 90 days." Boelens stated, "I really, truly don't think the term or the idea, the concept of 'Iowa Nice" is dead. It's alive and well. In fact, I think there's more generosity than any of us realize. My title is president but I tell you, I am the coordinator of generosity and it's incredible generosity. Every time that we've ever needed anything, the community steps up." Finally, Boelens stressed that they model the "welcome and celebrate" idea, as opposed to the "accept and overcome" philosophy. "Welcome them with open arms and smiles. Celebrate. Celebrate the differences," she explained. Boelens has stated that she is "desperate" for legal sponsors. If you know of anyone who can help, please contact her as soon as possible!
