Life Connections Peer Recovery Services is a non-for-profit organization that operates a Peer Recovery Center and Iowa's first Peer Run Respite House. Life Connections Peer Recovery Services supports individuals wanting to begin or continue their journey by connecting them with services and resources that can guide them in living their best lives. On Monday, we got to meet two individuals from Life Connections Peer Recovery Services -- Katelyn Akright and Aubrie Ottaver. Katelyn is the programs and operations director and Aubrie is a peer connections coach.

Akright spoke to us about their overall mission and objectives for Life Connections Peer Recovery Services. Over 51% of their board is made up of people "with lived experiences," Akright told us. "So we're just promoting the idea that people with mental health difficulties can be in leadership and can provide meaningful services to the people in our community."

Rhonda's House, an evidence-based, peer-run respite center for individuals experiencing or seeking to avert a psychiatric crisis that is based in DeWitt but will serve people from throughout the fivecounty Eastern Iowa region and the entire state of Iowa. Rhonda's House is a seven-day stay, free of charge, which offers a "bed and breakfast for your mental health," explained Ottaver. The Wellness Recovery Center is a place where individuals experiencing Mental Health issues can work on their recovery with trained Peer Support Specialists. What is unique about their organization is that they are a Peer-Run, Peer-Owned Organization; the staff offers many of the same lived experiences as their guests and serves as models of recovery. They will serve all individuals whether or not they can pay.
