

Shelly Wells Cain

Shelly Wells Cain joined us this week. A fellow Rotarian, Wells Cain is the Chief Development Officer for the Girl Scouts of Eastern Iowa and Western Illinois. Along with Wells Cain, Beth Garza, who specializes in grant writing, joined us.





Wells Cain discussed the Girl Scouts of Eastern Iowa and Western Illinois, which comprises thirty-one counties in Iowa and seven in Illinois (see map!). Wells Cain has been on the board for nearly eleven years and briefly discussed the merger of many councils several years ago. They have offices in Bettendorf, Cedar Rapids, Waterloo, Burlington, and Camp Little Cloud, which is right outside of Dubuque.

One of the missions of Girl Scouts is to build leadership skills, confidence, and service skills. "We are all about teaching girls about service and when I look at Rotarians I think really our job is to build the next generation of Rotarians...those who give back to our community," explained Wells Cain. In addition, the Girl Scouts focus on building courage, confidence, character, and skills that help lead the individual into making the world a better place. "That is what we're all about -- lifting girls up, helping them find who they are, find their own interests, giving them lots of experiences and really helping them to know that it's up to them to give back to the community. If they see a problem, it's up to them to help solve that problem...it's about having fun...being with friends, and being in human spaces."

Wells Cain finalized the presentation with the huge hit from the Girl Scouts --Cookies! There are only two bakers in the *country* that make these cookies and Wells Cain mentioned how the girls gain leadership skills by selling these. Girl Scout Cookies help with goal setting, decision making, money management, business ethics, and people skills (and they're pretty delicious too!).


