What is Supported Employment?

- Scope: Skyline Job Coaches provide services to individuals that enable them to obtain & maintain an individual job in competitive employment in a work setting that is integrated into the general workforce.
- Outcome: Sustained employment paid at, or above minimum wage and the level of benefits paid by an employer, in an integrated setting in the general workforce, in a job that meets personal career goals.
- Setting: Has to be a work setting where interactions are predominantly w/ coworkers or associates that do not have disabilities.

Our guest this week was Brandon Rumler, the Executive Director for The Skyline Center. Rumler took over as the Executive Director last year. The Skyline Center provides multiple services to over 120 adults with disabilities. Rumler focused on one particular service that they provide in his presentation, which was Supportive Employment. The graphic above explains what Supported Employment looks like.

The Skyline Center prepares individuals for community employment including career exploration. They take tours of local businesses, do job shadowing, and seek if there is a job that peaks the individual's interest. Furthermore, they also have employment assessments, assistive technology assessments, and trial work experiences. "We'll go out for a few hours and try a job with our job coach to see if it fits the individual skill set and if it's also something that they're interested in doing," Rumler detailed. There's also extensive training and constant support for both the employer and the employee. Rumler discussed the challenges that come with supportive employment. One of the biggest issues is trying to get past preconceived barriers. "We need to keep open minds that our individuals are very capable of doing a multitude of things." Rumler continued and stated that funding for the program isn't adequate to cover the cost so that barrier is a constant aspect that needs to be taken on.

Finally, Rumler took the last few minutes of his presentation to reflect on and express the gratitude and happiness that individuals who gain employment through Supported Employment. Rumler asked, "Do you think that you have an opportunity to partner with us or know of somebody who would be a good partner for supported employment?" 
