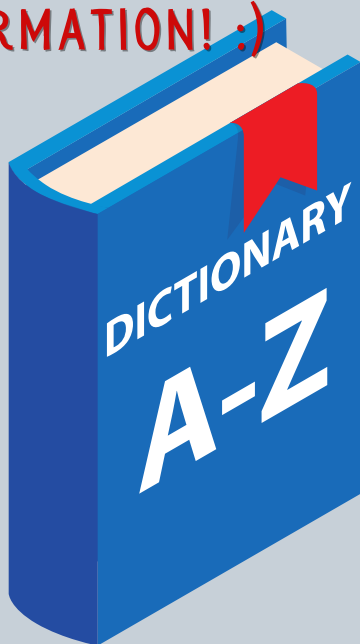

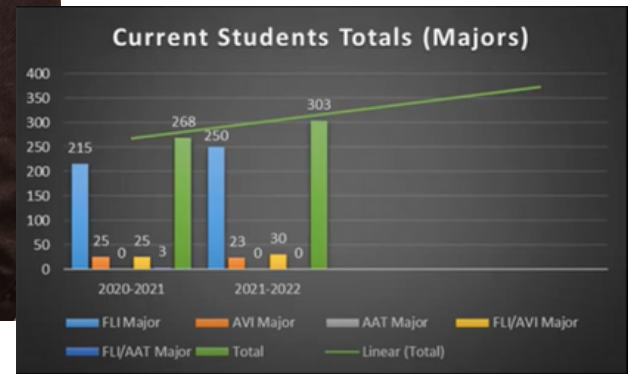

WE HAD THE PRIVILEGE OF HEARING FROM RANDY WARM, DIRECTOR OF AVIATION PROGRAMS WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF DUBUQUE. WARM IS FROM THE WATERLOO AREA AND RETIRED FROM THE ARMY WITH OVER 37 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE. THE UNIVERSITY OF DUBUQUE IS ONE OF THE LEADING AVIATION SCHOOLS IN THE NATION WITH 328 STUDENTS GOING TO 400 NEXT YEAR. THE TYPICAL PROGRESSION OF A STUDENT IN THE AVIATION PROGRAM IS BETWEEN 3-4 YEARS, WITH 300 HOURS OF TT. IN TERMS OF DIVERSITY IN THE AVIATION PROGRAM, THE UNIVERSITY OF DUBUQUE WAS ABOVE THE NATIONAL AVERAGE FOR BOTH WOMEN AND PEOPLE OF COLOR. HOWEVER, MORE RECENTLY, THE AIRLINES HAVE STARTED THEIR OWN ACADEMIES AND ARE TARGETING WOMEN AND MINORITIES, SO UNIVERSITY OF DUBUQUE'S NUMBERS HAVE GONE DOWN SLIGHTLY.

ONE OF THE CLASSES THAT WARM TEACHES IS A SAFETY AND ETHICS COURSE, WHICH IS TO PREPARE THE STUDENT TO BE FORWARD THINKING. WARM STATED, "WE NEED TO GET STUDENTS THINKING THE RIGHT WAY ON BEING A PILOT. YOU WANT TO HAVE A VERY RESPONSIBLE PERSON AND THAT'S SOMETHING WE WORK ON WITH OUR STUDENTS. BUILDING RESPONSIBILITY AND BEING A YOUNG PERSON SO THEY ARE PROBABLY A LITTLE BIT AHEAD OF THEIR PEERS IN COLLEGE AND MAKING GOOD DECISIONS IN LIFE AND NOT STOPPING THEMSELVES FROM DOING SOMETHING THAT WOULD CUT THEM OFF." WARM FURTHER EXPLAINED THAT THE DRUG TEST THE STUDENTS TWICE A YEAR. WHILE MARIJUANA MAY BE LEGAL IN SOME STATES, THE FAA DISAGREES AND "THERE IS VERY LITTLE TOLERANCE IN THE INDUSTRY FOR DRUGS AND ALCOHOL. THEY ARE VERY, VERY STRINGENT ON THOSE REGULATIONS." 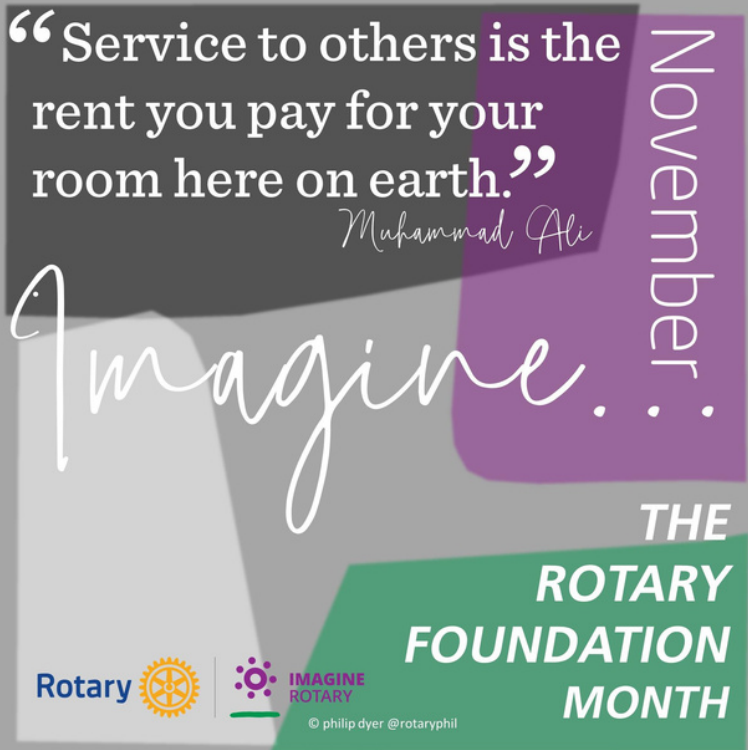

FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 1 OF RI'S FOUNDATION MONTH

SOMETIME IN 2010, IN LAKSHADWEEP, AN ARCHIPELAGO OF 36 ISLANDS NEAR SRI LANKA, A BOAT ACCIDENT CLAIMED THE LIFE OF NEONA, AN 18-MONTH-OLD GIRL. IN MEMORY OF THEIR DAUGHTER, HER PARENTS GOT TOGETHER WITH THE ROTARY CLUB OF COCHIN AND STARTED NEONA, A FREE HEART SURGERY PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN WITH CONGENITAL HEART DEFECTS IN COLOMBO, SRI LANKA. RECENTLY, FIVE CHILDREN FROM COLOMBO WHO WERE BORN WITH CONGENITAL HEART DEFECTS WERE SUCCESSFULLY OPERATED ON IN KOCHI UNDER THE PROGRAM. THE ROTARY FOUNDATION'S SPONSORED PROJECT WAS JOINTLY IMPLEMENTED BY THE ROTARY CLUB OF COCHIN WEST AND ROTARY CLUB OF COLOMBO WEST AT A COST OF RS 2 CRORE (US\$243,955). ACCORDING TO THE NEW INDIAN EXPRESS, IN A REPORT PUBLISHED ON NOVEMBER 5, 2022, THE HEART SURGERY WAS DONE AT AMRITA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES AND RESEARCH CENTER, KOCHI.

A TOTAL OF 65 CHILDREN WILL BENEFIT FROM THE PROJECT. ADDITIONALLY, SRI LANKAN DOCTORS AND NURSES WILL BE TRAINED AT AMRITA HOSPITAL. ROTARY DISTRICT 3201 GOVERNOR S RAJMOHAN NAIR INAUGURATED THE PROJECT AT PANAMPILLY NAGAR KMA HALL.

NOVEMBER IS FOUNDATION MONTH. THE ROTARY FOUNDATION TRANSFORMS YOUR GIFTS INTO PROJECTS THAT CHANGE LIVES BOTH CLOSE TO HOME AND AROUND THE WORLD.
