

On Monday, we were fortunate enough to meet Tammy McClimon, from our local chapter of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library.

McClimon was in education for forty years in DeWitt and was also a librarian. About fourteen years ago, a group of educators decided they wanted to start the Imagination Library and brought it into Eastern Iowa! Dolly Parton's Imagination Library began in Clinton County in 2012 to promote childhood reading through books. One thousand children get a book monthly through ongoing grant writing and fundraising. Inspired by her father's inability to read and write Dolly started her Imagination Library in 1992 for the children within her home county. Today, her program spans five countries and gifts over 2 million free books each month to children around the world. McClimon sweetly explained that Parton is "probably one of the most generous people on the planet, I think. It seems like when something goes wrong she's one of the first people to get it started."

McClimon and the working board of directors are all librarians, teachers, and educators. They've given over 135,000 books in the last fourteen years! When first signed up at birth, you are given "The Little Engine that Could," which McClimon thinks is the perfect metaphor for the local chapter. Currently, they have about a thousand kids in Clinton County, but could easily serve around 3,000, per McClimon. The program consists of sending a book to a child every month, from birth through the age of five. "Why is this so exciting? Because this child owns a book. It's their book -- they're getting something in the mail, someone knows who they are, which just encourages kids even more. There is a feature now that you can sign your child up and Dolly Parton will sing them happy birthday on their birthday so that's exciting!"

It costs roughly \$30 to sponsor a child for this program. Thank you, Tammy, for all that you do!
