WATCH OUR MEETING HERE

We had the immense pleasure of hearing from fellow Rotarian and new Superintendent of Clinton Community Schools, Dr. Wes Golden, alongside Mariah Reeves, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, who both discussed the "Empowering All: Future Ready" program through Clinton schools.

Golden started by discussing how important the Mission, Vision, and Values are and how they're at the center of everything CCSD does for its students. "The mission of the Clinton Community School District is to educate all students to their highest level of achievement through an engaging curriculum in a caring community," stated Golden. "I always break this down with folks because I think there are really important components here -- we need to really pull out..but it's that all students. We're here for every kid...how do we help them become their best version of themselves and providing them with opportunities, in a pathway for their future. We try to do that through an engaging curriculum." Furthermore, Golden explained, "There's a lot of talk back and forth on what was most important to us as a leadership team and it's empowering all. We're here to empower everyone that we come into contact with and that's parents, that's our community, that's our students, that's our teachers, that's our parents, our bus drivers, you name it. If you're involved with this community, in our school district we want to provide empowerment so that our students are ready for their future."

Golden introduced us to Mariah Reeves, who discussed Equitable and Experiential Academic Programming. Reeves explained how this process looks, including "adding a purpose behind the diploma. They are ready for that next chapter of their lives." This programming comes in the following stages:

Awareness (2024-25): Introducing students to careers that help them make decisions about future coursework and work-based learning opportunities. Think: Guest Speakers!

Exposure: (2025-26): Work-based learning opportunities that allow students to engage more actively with career experiences. Think: Job Shadows!

Engagement (2026-27): Work-based learning experiences that allow students to learn more about careers through practical applications activities to develop skills and knowledge. Think:


