Hey Jules, this is Brian. Ah... listen, I'm on a plane that has been hijacked... if things don't go well, and they're not looking good, I want you to know that I absolutely love you. I want you to do good, have good times, same with my parents. I'll see you when you get here. I want you to know that I totally love you. Bye, babe, hope I will call you.

Twenty-two years ago, our country suffered one of the most horrific tragedies we've gone through. It's a date that will forever remain in our minds. City Administrator of Clinton and retired Lt Colonel Matt Brooke presented to our club about the tragic event.

At 8:46 AM the first plane, American Airlines Flight 11, which had originated from Boston, was piloted into the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City. The second plane, United Airlines Flight 175, also from Boston, struck the south tower 17 minutes later. At this point, there was no doubt that the United States was under attack. Regular passengers became American Heroes on Flight 93, when they overtook the terrorists and crashed the plane, the attack on the U.S. Capitol was thwarted. Some 2,750 people were killed in New York, 184 at the Pentagon, and 40 in Pennsylvania. Three hundred and forty-three firefighters died on September 11, 2001. Three hundred and thirty-one firefighters who responded on September 11 have died, post-attack. "Another interesting tidbit," Brooke stated, "Of the 343 firefighters at perished that day, sixty of their family members have joined the fire force in NewYork."

Rescue operations began almost immediately as the country and the world sought to come to grips with the enormity of the losses. Brooke stated, "Literally hundreds that showed up to help clean up the site as well...Kevin Gyrion, who was with the Chicago Police at the time, he actually went out there. He was there day two, helping."

Then President Bush stated, at 8:30 PM on September 11: "We will make no distinction between the terrorists who committed these acts and those who harbor them." Bush's robust response to the attacks drove his poll ratings from 55 percent favorable before September 11 to 90 percent in the days after, the highest ever recorded for a president. On May 02, 2011, under the direction of then-President Obama, Delta Team Six killed Osama Bin Laden.

LITERACY MOMENTS

This is week 2 of Rotary's Basic Education and Literacy Month. Keep in mind, our goal as Rotarians is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education, and increase adult literacy.

This week our literacy minute focuses on those 4 and 5 year old preschoolers. This is a great time to build their vocabulary, sentences, storytelling, and comprehension skills. Dialogic reading or having a conversation around a book while empowering a child to build their vocabulary, expand their ability to talk in sentences is a great way to begin. Read the story more than once - start to identify objects or discuss new words they may hear in a book. During the second reading, ask more open ended questions using how, who, what, and where. Remember to count to 5 after asking the question so the child has ample opportunity to make the connection and respond before you continue. When they do respond, add to their words with more descriptive vocabulary. Finally, on the third reading, let the child you are reading tell the story in their own words. You may have to help along the way but that is part of the fun of the shared reading experience.

What we can do as Rotarians: Share this information with others by forming a literacy committee in your club and offering to read aloud, one-on-one, with preschool children using this method. Youtube videos share this technique. Or if you want more information ask someone on the Literacy Committee.
