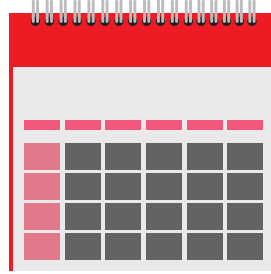

THIS ALL FORMS THE "PORTRAIT OF A GRADUATE." CLINTON COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT IS STILL WORKING ON WHAT THIS LOOKS LIKE FOR A CLINTON GRADUATE, BUT THE LEADERS ARE GOING TO THE COMMUNITY FOR INPUT.

THE PORTRAIT OF A GRADUATE IS IN PHASE 2 OF 3. IN SPRING 2022, THE TEAM WORKING ON THIS WILL GATHER THE FEEDBACK FROM THE COMMUNITY, AND IDEALLY, IN MAY, THIS WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE SCHOOL BOARD FOR ADOPTION. 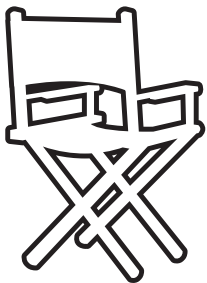

FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 2 OF RI'S MONTH OF BASIC EDUCATION & LITERACY.

HAPPY LABOR DAY 2021 TO ALL ROTARIANS AND OTHERS IN THE UNITED STATES!

ALL OVER THE UNITED STATES SCHOOLS HAVE RESUMED AND ROTARIANS HAVE HELPED DISTRIBUTE DICTIONARIES, SHOES AND OTHER NECESSARY SUPPLIES TO NEEDY CHILDREN TO ENABLE THEM FOCUS BETTER ON THEIR STUDIES. IN OTHER PARTS OF THE WORLD, TRF IS SPONSORING PROJECTS AIMED AT PROMOTING LITERACY, ESPECIALLY AMONG TEENAGE GIRLS IN REMOTE CORNERS OF THE WORLD. ADDRESSING HIS "FELLOW GAME CHANGERS" IN THE CURRENT ISSUE OF ROTARY MAGAZINE, ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT, SHEKHAR MEHTA, HIGHLIGHTS THE IMPORTANCE OF EDUCATING THE FEMALE PERSON:

"WITHOUT EDUCATION, ILLITERATE CHILDREN BECOME ILLITERATE ADULTS. TODAY, 14 PER CENT OF THE WORLD'S ADULT POPULATION – 762 MILLION PEOPLE – LACK BASIC READING AND WRITING SKILLS. TWO-THIRDS OF THAT GROUP ARE WOMEN. LITERACY AND NUMERACY SKILLS ARE ESSENTIAL TO OBTAIN BETTER HOUSING, HEALTHCARE AND JOBS OVER A LIFETIME. ESPECIALLY FOR GIRLS AND WOMEN, LITERACY CAN BE A LIFE-OR-DEATH ISSUE. IF ALL GIRLS COMPLETED THEIR PRIMARY EDUCATION, THERE WOULD BE FAR FEWER MATERNAL DEATHS. AND A CHILD IS MORE LIKELY TO SURVIVE PAST AGE 5 IF HE OR SHE IS BORN TO A MOTHER WHO CAN READ. IMPROVING OUTCOMES FOR MORE PEOPLE WORLDWIDE IS POSSIBLE ONLY IF COUNTRIES REMOVE BARRIERS TO EDUCATION FOR GIRLS. THE ECONOMIC ARGUMENT FOR DOING SO IS CLEAR: IN SOME COUNTRIES WHERE SCHOOLING IS GEARED TOWARD BOYS, THE COST OF MISSED ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY IS MORE THAN \$1 BILLION PER YEAR."
