When discussing prescription drug use, there can be a lot of misconceptions about what is appropriate and where to take expired or unused medications. Ellen Gackle joined us from Clinton's Area Substance Abuse Council to discuss these issues. Gackle is a prevention specialist with ASAC. Gackle stated, "Medications can help us. They're very beneficial and we aren't saying that they shouldn't be



used at all. They can help us alleviate pain or other symptoms. We can increase our live expectancy because of the advanced medical prescription drugs...so we aren't saying they're not helpful... but they're helpful when used, as directed, by a licensed health care official. Misuse of prescription medication is using more than prescribed, sharing with friends or family, and/or mixing with alcohol to get a pleasurable effect. This is regardless of the intention behind the use -- whether it's good or bad intentions, it it is labeled as misusing and can create very adverse side effects for the person. The frequency and severity of prescription drug abuse are so bad, it is considered an epidemic.

This epidemic can affect anyone, regardless of background, age, race, what community you live in. "The majority of people, or 54%, of those who misuse prescription opioids painkillers state that they got their prescription from family members. When you look specifically at teens, that number jumps to twothirds."



#### FOUNDATION MINUTE

Welcome to Week 2 of Basic Education & Literacy Month!

Global Grants have been supporting peace building and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community development. The Rotary Foundation has added a new area of Global Grant focus, Supporting the Environment. According to Past President Mark Maloney, TRF has allotted more than \$18,000,000 to environment-related projects over the past 5 years and creating this new focus will give Rotarians more ways to positively impact the world. Commenting on the environmental area of focus, Randy Roberts of the Rotary Club of Fort Wayne, (IN) praised RI for doing "...what is best for our planet...This is the only home we are leaving for our children and grandchildren. We must help solve the climate change issue or we jeopardize all other humanitarian work we do through the first six areas of focus."

The Food Depot in Santa Fe (NM) provides over 500,000 pounds of food each month, which over time has increased due to much need in the community. In April alone, more than 1,000,000 pounds of food was distributed, and between March and June, the depot provided over 3,300,000 meals. Responding to these overwhelming needs, the Rotary Club of Los Alamos applied for and received a generous grant from Rotary District 5520 and TRF to sponsor a Peace and Health Project to provide over 40,000 meals to needy families. Explaining why her club chose this project, club president Laura Gonzales cited that New Mexico ranked second highest for projected overall childhood food insecurity and fifth highest in the nation for projected overall food insecurity. "Food insecurity is a critical issue in New Mexico all the time. The needs now, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, are staggering. Rotary is a service organization and we are proactively addressing this problem." This past Saturday The Rotary Club of Los Alamos worked with Meals of Hope, a Florida-based food packing organization, to pack bags of ready-to-cook meals of beans, rice, and macaroni and cheese.

"With the global population reaching near eight billion, protecting the environment is increasingly important...It is time for us to use our collective resources to invest in a smart and efficient way of protecting our environment. 3. Polio mostly affects children under five years of age. This year, over forty million children under the age of five missed their routine immunizations due to Covid, leading to a spike in cases of Polio and other preventable diseases.

The Final Two Polio Endemic Countries: **Pakistan** - Three new Polio cases reported this week. Sixty-eight Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 08/17/20. Pakistan reported 147 Wild Polio cases in 2019. Seventeen Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan. **Afghanistan** - Four new Polio cases reported this past week. Forty-four Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent cases had an onset of paralysis on 8/12/20. Afghanistan reported twenty-nine Wild Polio cases in 2019. No Polio-Positive Environmental Sample was reported this week in Afghanistan.
