

This week, we had the great pleasure of hearing from former Rotary president, Shannon Sander-Welzien and Michelle Plasschaert about the YWCA Empowerment Center's Supportive Housing Initiative update.

"The only known solution to homelessness is housing," explained Plasschaert, which is why the Empowerment Center focuses on the 'Housing First" model, where once obtained, other barriers, such as lack of employment, addiction, etc. can then be worked through. The main cause of homelessness in Clinton County is the lack of affordable housing. One out of every three residents in Clinton County is at or near the poverty level. ALICE -- Asset Limited, Income-Constrained, Employed -- are households that earn above the federal poverty level (FPL) but cannot afford the basic cost of living in their county. Despite struggling to make ends meet, ALICE households often do not qualify for public assistance.

The YWCA Intake Hotline receives 4,000+ calls in a year, with 100-200 applications on their intake list. "In Clinton County, homelessness is the number four top health need," stated Plasschaert. Sander-Welzien explained, "We have a major housing needs in Iowa." Sander-Welzien went on to discuss some statistics from Clinton County and the state of Iowa, as well as how we need to work together to decrease homelessness and offer affordable housing solutions. "We need to address those fears and not criminalize homelessness or criminalize affordable housing because we really need it for our community to thrive. It's part of ALICE -- your waitress, maybe even your teacher...those folks are struggling to pay for their housing."

The end goal is to graduate individuals out of the "cycle" of homelessness, move into their own homes, create a more efficient and accessible support network, but most importantly, to improve the lives of the affected individuals and their families. Iowa grows when we embrace the economic diversity of housing. The cost of doing nothing is something we cannot afford.


