Former IQC Rotary Club member Jay Justin has been in a leadership role with Big Brothers / Big Sisters for 15 years. He has also been involved with Little League for several years.

For more than 100 years, Big Brothers / Big Sisters has operated under the belief that inherent in every child is the ability to succeed and thrive in life. As the nation's largest donor, and volunteer-supported mentoring network, Big Brothers / Big Sisters makes meaningful, monitored matches between adult volunteers ("Bigs") and children ("Littles"), ages 6 through 18, in communities across the country. They develop positive relationships that have a direct and lasting effect on the lives of young people. The program is school and community based.

In 1990, one out of four families were led by a single parent. That statistic has now changed to one out of three. And many of those single parents are grandparents.

Mission: Provide children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally supported one-to-one relationships that change their lives for the better, forever.

Vision: All children achieve success in life.

Accountability: By partnering with parents/guardians, volunteers, and others in the community we are accountable for each child in our program achieving:

- Higher aspirations, greater confidence, and better relationships;
- Avoidance of risky behaviors;
- Educational success.

Big Brothers / Big Sisters funding locally comes from fund raisers:

- Plant sales (\$190,000 per year);
- *Putt Around*, miniature golf;
- This year the big event is *Over the Edge* ... repelling down the Hotel Blackhawk. 110 people have already signed up for the August 24th and 25th event.
