He has spent time with three host families (a typical situation for exchange students).

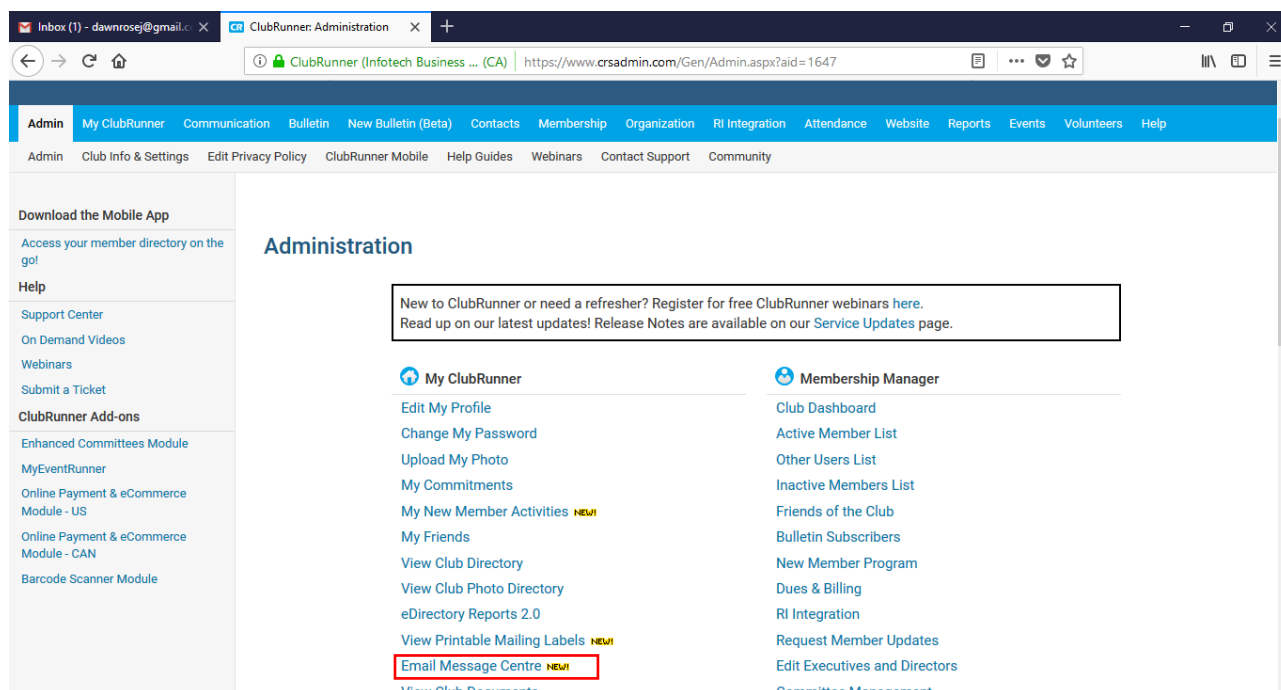

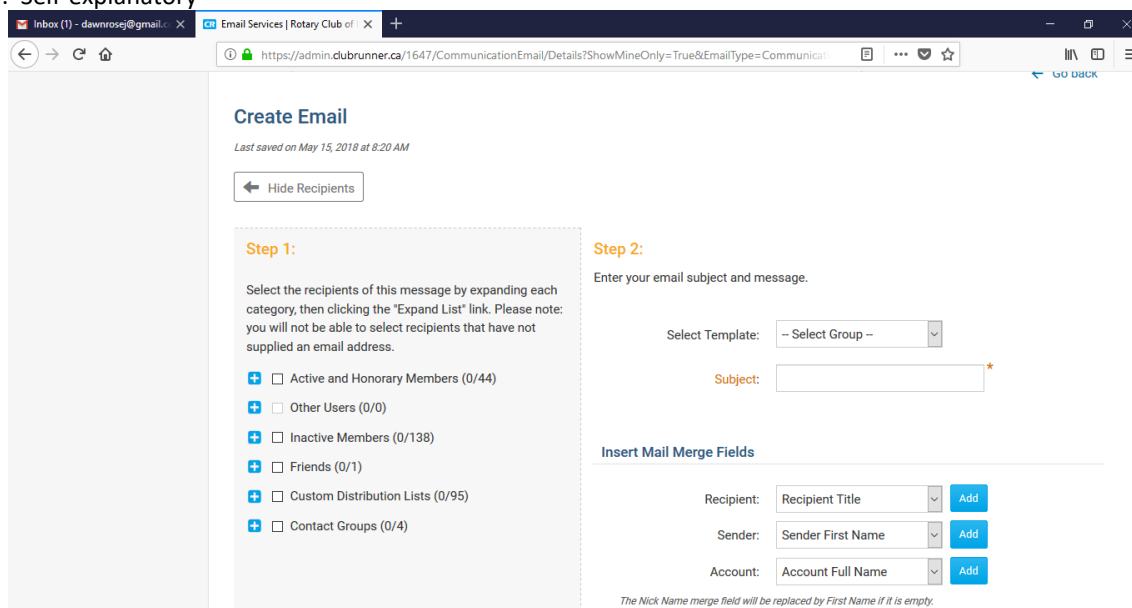


Step 1: Compose new message (orange box).
