2011: Central Hockey League folded before season started and Mallards joined East Coast Hockey League.

2014: Central Hockey League folded before the season started and the Mallards went to the East Coast Hockey League.

2017: Mallards announce they are folding, ECHL has rights to the name.

2018: New local owners John Dawson and Ryan Mosley buy a Southern Professional Hockey League franchise and launch it as the Quad City Storm.


