Scott County Sheriff Tim Lane

Friday, we're back at the Steeplegate, with a Zoom option, to hear Scott County Sheriff Tim Lane talk about "Trends, Changes and Activities in Law Enforcement."

As a life-long resident of Scott County, Tim Lane was always interested in a career in law enforcement. Tim is a 1986 North Scott High School graduate and he earned his bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from St. Ambrose University at age 20; and was driven to begin his career with the Scott County Sheriff's Office.

Tim began as a correctional officer in the Scott County Jail in 1989; hired by Sheriff Ashcraft. When Tim became eligible to apply for deputy sheriff, he interviewed with Sheriff Ashcraft and was told the Sheriff was looking for candidates with education, training and experience. Tim says Sheriff Ashcraft's mentorship and pearls of wisdom became the foundation of Tim's career philosophy over the past 31 years.

Tim performed many functions with the Scott County Sheriff's Office. He has 25 years of experience as a patrolman and felt at home in a patrol car. He was promoted to the rank of lieutenant in 2006 and commanded the day shift patrol, training, school liaisons, DARE, and the Scott County SOU Drug Enforcement Unit. Tim was also the coordinator for the Honor Guard.

Tim was elected Sheriff in November of 2016 and took office in January, 2017.

The sheriff completed the Southern Police Institute Executive Leadership Program in 2008, graduated as a certified public manager from Drake University in 2001, and earned distinction completing the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia in 2015. Few in our local community have held this recognition and Tim is now a member of the FBI National Academy Associates.

Habitat for Humanity build

North Scott Rotary's 2018-19 Impact Grant of \$15,000 was in support of Habitat for Humanity of the Quad Cities' house No. 118, located at 719 E. 6th St., Davenport. The official groundbreaking was Sept. 7, 2019. Last week, Rebecca Ludin, volunteer coordinator and family services director for Habitat, said they were not able to get the foundation in before winter. They were FINALLY able to start last Saturday, Aug. 1.

Volunteer opportunities are possible. Rebecca wrote: "We would love to have volunteers from your club come out to help build this home. Please let me know if this is something you would be interested in and if you have any dates in mind. Thursdays. Fridays and Saturdays are best for us. Our schedule is quite open and very flexible." The owner will be Demissi Diibom, an immigrant in 2018 from the west African country of Togo. She speaks French and English and works in the office at Tyson Foods. She has two young daughters, Faith and Ruth. "This is my dream come true. Soon I'll be living in my own

house," she said at the groundbreaking. The average cost of a Habitat house is \$126,000, thanks to donations and inkind labor. House payments are calculated no more than 30 percent of monthly income. A typical mortgage is \$80,000.
