'Lindsay's Legacy'

Program arranged by Marcia Brandt: Diane Koster is a wife, mother, grandmother, small business owner, and also holds the titles of Women's Health Grant Specialist and certified health coach at Genesis Health System. Born and raised in Iowa City, she moved to the Quad Cities in 1982, and currently lives in Davenport with her husband, Kevin, and two dogs, Sadie & Lola.

On Feb. 1, 2017, Diane's 29-year-old daughter, Lindsay Thul (a former North Scott Rotarian) lost her life due to Inflammatory Breast Cancer (IBC), just 10 short months after being diagnosed. Many of you may have followed Lindsay's journey through the online posts she made during those 10 months. Based around Lindsay's
