North Scott Rotary Guardians of Integrity

Congratulations, Greg!

At last Friday's Zoom meeting, **Greg Schaapveld** was recognized as North Scott Rotary's recipient of the 2020 Paul E. Hellwege Guardian of Integrity award. The award honors individuals who have made contributions in business, media, academia or government and who have by their actions, writing, policies and public pronouncements strengthened and fostered development of integrity and ethical practices, and who have made sacrifices and/or undertaken risks to uphold Rotary's Core Value of Integrity. The awards are named after the late Past District Governor Paul E. Hellwege of Boone (1954-55) who, at the time of his death in 2010 had been a past district governor for more than half of the 105-year existence of Rotary, whose life exemplified integrity. Greg is one of nine recognized in 2020 by District

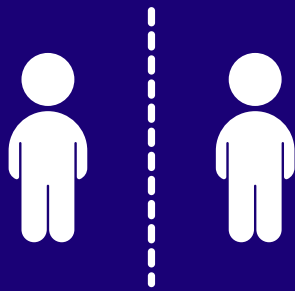

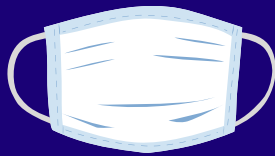

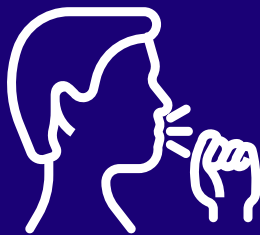
