Child Passenger Safety in Scott County
According to National Highway Traffic Safety
Administration research, 8,325 lives of children
under age 5 have been saved by the proper use of
child restraints during the past 30 years. In 2006
among children under 5, an estimated 425 lives were
saved by child restraint use. Research shows that
child restraints provide the best protection for all
children up to age 8; after age 8 seat belts provide

the best protection. All 50 states have laws requiring children to be restrained in vehicles. Although parents and caregivers have begun to understand the need for child passenger safety devices, NHTSA research shows that three out of four child safety seats are improperly installed in vehicles. Child passenger safety experts advocate the importance of children being safely restrained in vehicles, every trip, and every time.

There are expert resources in our community to ensure that child passenger safety seats are properly installed. In 1999, MEDIC EMS began its free car seat inspection program at its North Scott County station, becoming the first free-standing child passenger safety seat inspection program in the state of Iowa. Since that time, other local fit station programs have become available in the cities of Davenport, Moline, and Rock Island, with free safety seat inspections available from 9:00 a.m. to noon every Saturday at one of these Quad City locations.

Join Linda Frederiksen, a certified child passenger safety technician from MEDIC EMS, to discuss the positive impact that child passenger safety programs have had in Scott County, as well the *4 Steps for Kids* guidelines for determining which restraint system is best suited to protect children based upon age and size.
