BILL GLUBA, Mayor of Davenport

Mayor Bill Gluba informed 58 Rotarians and guests of the accomplishments that he has made to the City of Davenport, since he has been in office this past year. He has ended the bickering that was taking place at City Hall. He appointed Gene Meeker to the committee of economic development, reduced overtime and cut down on training costs. Thirty positions were not filled when employees either quit or retired. The new budget was approved without any lay offs or increase in property tax.

His concerns are that \$281 million dollars are in the budget for improvements to streets and sewers, over the next six years. Only one new house was built in Davenport in January, 2009. The population of Davenport increased by 94 people in 2008, but he believes that one half of the 94 are homeless. New projects that are pending are the street extension between 65^{th} & Brady to Eastern Ave. Also, the building of another new library in the area of 53^{rd} & Eastern.

Chuck Briegel presided over the business meeting. Lee Ittenbach did the set up, Tom Bylund was the greeter, Jeff Ashcraft was the song leader and John Maxwell gave the invocation. Randy Zobrist was the sergeant and raised \$15 in fines. He also welcomed back Ann Hanson, as a server for the Steeplegate. Becky Bray introduced guests Mary Macumber-Schmidt, guest of Anita Wubbena, Russ Williams, counselor from Davenport North High School and students, Walter Hickman & Joe Kern.

Since it was the first Friday in March, birthdays were celebrated. \$19 was collected for the education fund from cake sales. Nina Golden gave \$20 to the education fund in honor of her son attending the Youth Leadership conference in Washington, D.C. John Maxwell had visited Elza & Teri Sager in South Texas and gave the club greetings from Elza. Bill Tubbs promoted the Davenport Chordbusters Annual Spring Show on March 14 at the Capitol Theatre. Tickets are \$15 and he welcomed everyone to attend. Bert Vigen will be chaperoning the second Honor Flight as a guardian with a Ridgecrest residence on April 15. Otto Stender participated in the first honor flight several weeks ago.
