New Member Procedures

Several questions have been asked about how to bring in a new member, so here goes.

- 1. A new member may be proposed, by a current member, to the club secretary, and therefore the board, before or after they have attended a meeting. It is asked that this be kept confidential. If you need help in getting them to come, submit their name and ask for help.
- 2. The Board acts on this proposal.
- 3. After the person has attended three meetings, and the sponsor has talked to them about requirements and responsibilities, they are passed on to the classification committee for approval.
- 4. After approval from the Classification Committee, the proposed member is returned to the Board for final approval.
- 5. A letter of intent is issued to the prospective member, spelling out financial and attendance requirements expected.
- 6. When this signed letter is returned, the prospective member will be published in the club newsletter and seven days is allowed for comment by the members.
- 7. The new member is eligible for induction at the next available club meeting
- 8. This procedure is spelled out in the club "By Laws,", which follow Rotary International "By Laws".
