John Maxwell Trip to Benue Nigeria

Have you ever heard of Benue, Nigeria? (Pronounced "BenWay"). Neither had I, or John Maxwell. John recently went there on a mission trip to teach agriculture.

Benue is not arid as I tend to think of Nigeria. John says that the average rainfall is over that of Iowa.

Come hear John and see the slides he has to help tell the story of his expedition.

Benue is a state in North-central Nigeria with a population of about 2.8 million in 1991. Tiv, Idoma, and Igede are spoken predominantly. There are other ethnic groups as well. These include Etulo and Abakwa. With its capital at Makurdi, Benue is a rich agricultural region; some of the crops grown there are: potatoes, cassava, soya bean, guinea corn, flax, yams and beniseed.

Benue State is named after the Benue River and was formed from the former Benue-Plateau State in 1976, along with Igala, which had been part of Kwara State. In 1991 some areas, along with areas in Kwara, became part of the new Kogi State.

Gabriel Suswam is the Governor and Steven Lawani is the Deputy Governor. Both are People's Democratic Party (PDP) members.
