

Dr. Michael Giudici, M.D. Cardiovascular Medicine



Dr. Giudici is a Quad Cities native. A graduate from Assumption High School in Davenport, he received his B.A. in Math and Chemistry from Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, and his B.S. in Medicine from the University of South Dakota. He received his Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of Iowa and completed his Internship at the University of Iowa Hospitals.

After serving as a Primary Care Physician for the U.S.A.F, he completed his Residency in Internal Medicine and his Fellowship in Cardiology at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in Philadelphia. He completed his Fellowship in Interventional Cardiology and Electrophysiology at the University of Missouri Hospitals in Columbia, Missouri.

Dr. Giudici specializes in Electrophysiology and is involved in the research and development of numerous devices and techniques in the electrophysiology field. He has published over 150 scientific papers and has been named as a Best Doctor in America. In 2007, he was one of 50 physicians in North America to be awarded fellowship by the Heart Rhythm Society.

Dr. Giudici is board certified in Internal Medicine, Cardiovascular Disease and Cardiac Electrophysiology. He joined Cardiovascular Medicine, P.C. in 1989 and is licensed to practice in both Iowa and Illinois. He is available for outpatient consultation and follow-up visits at the Davenport East Rusholme, Burlington, DeWitt and Muscatine locations. He has staff privileges at Genesis Medical Centers and Trinity Medical Centers.

JOHN MAXWELL: Nigeria

John and Lisa gave a very interesting report on their trip to Benue, Nigeria, Africa in June of 2008. John and Lisa were invited to Benue by Governor Gabriel Sasswon to observe the agricultural practices there. They were hosted by the Governor in his home. They were met at a primitive airport by two armed guards who remained with them for the entire week. Everything was surrounded by walls and fences. Also on the trip were the owners of Durant Implement.

The climate is warm year round, about 80 - 90 degrees. The humidity was 60 per cent. A lot of flowers and fruits grow here, especially oranges, mangos and pineapple. Food was sold along the roadsides for the visitors and tourists. A popular meat was goat and some marinated fish. These were not desirable items to John and Lisa. They ate mostly fresh fruits on the trip.

The roads were in great disrepair and the drivers were wild. They would slow down for a pothole and then speed back up to 80 mph. They traveled in either a BMW or Nissan truck, accompanied by armed guards. Each village was 5-10 acres and consisted of members of one immediate family. The most frustrating part for John was that the machinery and feed mills were abandon when they broke down, as no one knew how to fix them, nor were parts available. Bill Tubbs told about Julie Mulligan from Canada, leader of a GSE team to Nigeria, who was kidnapped and held captive for 10 days. She was finally released with no ransom money paid by Rotary. Ken Tank gave \$50 to the Foundation for his 50th wedding anniversary. Chuck Briegel said they his son Tom, won a college golf tournament in Marshalltown, IA. Merle Anderson was awarded with a "Rotary Volunteers" plaque that he so deserves, as he has just left for his 7th volunteer mission to Moldova. He has also traveled to Ukraine.

Eighty three members and guests attended the meeting on a beautiful May Day! Birthday cake was served and \$25 was donated to the education fund. \$18 was collected in fines by John Maxwell. Jan Trimble gave the invocation and Jeff Ashcraft was the song leader. Guests present were our outgoing assistant governor, Jim Stein from Muscatine Rotary Club and Debi Ervin from the Iowa Quad City Club. Other guests were Mardy Morrow, Anita Grove, Nyle Paper, Jean Keppy, Jean Schinckel and Melody Blazevic. Also Clyde Martin, guest of Serge Pasheev and Mr. & Mrs. Muehlbech from Germany, guests of Jack Schinckel.

It was reported by Dennis Peterson that Keith Mattke is hospitalized at Genesis West with pneumonia and that Lynne Chamberlin is moving back to Genesis West for intensive therapy on Monday, May 4. He will be on the 5th floor. The club wishes a speedy recovery to both!
