Fifty-three Rotary clubs across Iowa sponsored over 165 students to attend this day-long seminar.

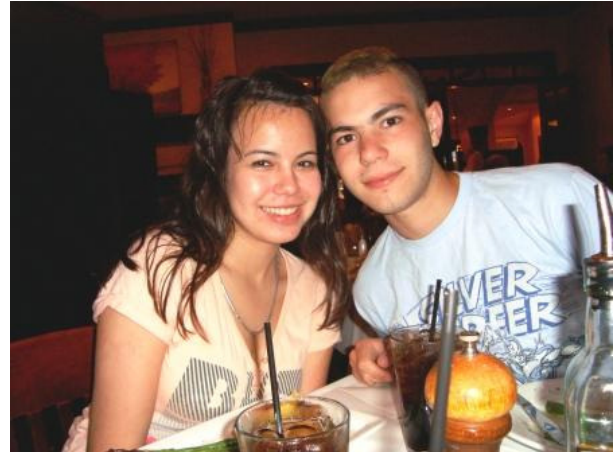

Dr. Michael Giudici, M.D.

Dr. Michael Giudici with Cardiovascular Medicine in Davenport gave a very informative program on atrial fibrillation. The primary symptom of this is irregular heart beat, which is caused by no blood being present in the top of the heart. There are many rhythm control drugs available. The surgery that Dr. Giudici does to cure atrial fibrillation is catheter ablation. This procedure currently takes about 4 hours and is done with a general anesthesia. He began these surgeries at St. Luke's Hospital in Davenport in 1991.

Currently Palmer College and Genesis Medical Centers are working together to regress coronary disease. The method they are using is called Chelation Therapy. It is a method to open blocked arteries and restore blood flow to the heart without surgery.

Dr. Giudici loves to bicycle, especially around Europe. He goes to France to bike every two years in conjunction with a medical conference that he attends there.

Seventy nine members and guests were present at Friday's meeting. Guests were Joe Hutter, guest of Becky Bray and Bill Burress, Davenport Rotary president. Bill was there to promote his club's Rotary Cup Golf Outing on Friday, May 15. Mardy Morrow was inducted as a new member by past president, Bob Fox. She works for Ruhl and Ruhl Insurance in Davenport and her sponsor is Jody Johnston-Mohr.
