CLAUDIA ROBINSON - GILDA'S CLUB

Claudia gave an informative program about the local Gilda's Club in Davenport. It is truly a place of Cancer Support for the Whole Family. Gilda's Club is named in memory of Saturday Night Live's comedienne, Gilda Radner. She died of ovarian cancer in 1989. She once said that cancer gave her "membership to an elite club I'd rather not belong to", which is where the name "Gilda's Club" originated. There are 28 counties served in Iowa and Illinois by Gilda's Club.

Gilda's Club is not a sad and depressing place. It is a support group of people with a staff of only five. It is open from 8 A.M. to 9 P.M. For some members who come here, this is the only family that they have. Everything at Gilda's Club is free to the cancer patients and their families. The average donation that they receive is a mere \$25.00. They have received enough \$25 donations to stay open for 10 years. Every week day has a full schedule of classes and workshops offered to the membership. They offer art workshops, cooking workshops, wellness group meetings, knitting and crocheting classes, yoga sessions, sign language, dancing and card clubs. The list continues on.
