Donchez comes to Davenport after serving as a consultant to the Easton (Pa.) Police Department following his 2006 retirement from the Bethlehem (Pa.) Police Department. He served 25 years in Bethlehem, including his final 5 1/2 years as commissioner, or chief, of the department. His wife, Beverly, and teenage son, Jacob, stayed in Bethlehem until Jacob graduated.

After retirement, Donchez thought consulting would be enough to replace policing. He was wrong.

"I wanted to be back in policing so much, I was ready to make a move," the Bethlehem native said.
