FRANK DONCHEZ - DAVENPORT CHIEF OF POLICE

Davenport Rotarian and Chief of Police, Frank Donchez, has been in Iowa only since March 2008. Previous to that he lived and worked in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, for over 25 years. He retired from police work in Pennsylvania but found that retirement was not for him. He applied for the Davenport job and was hired. He now has 11 bosses, the city administrator and 10 aldermen.

Mr. Donchez recently graduated from an F.B.I. school. He has always been interested in taking classes and gaining more knowledge. The state of Iowa only gets 6 spots in the school per year, and he felt lucky to get one of them. He spoke about the active crime areas in Davenport. Some of the most serious are 14th Street and Gaines and Centennial Park in downtown Davenport by the river.

The biggest complaint to the police department is about traffic. A lot of these are about motorcycles and the noise they make. The Davenport Police Department is the only police department in the Quad Cities that is accredited. They do not believe in pursuing criminals to the extent of putting citizens in danger. He stated that the drug problem in Davenport is no worse than anywhere else. Sixty members and guests attended on Friday, June 19. Guests were Alex Pasheyev and Anastasia Pasheyev, both guests of Serge Pasheev. Scott Case gave \$25 to the educational fund to announce his recent job change to join Iowa Realty Co., based in Des Moines. Julia Blazevic gave \$18 in honor of her daughter Melanie's 18th birthday.

Gary Lynch conducted his last business meeting at the Steeplegate. He thanked everyone for the support he received this past Rotary year. Eric Langan suggested a round of applause to thank Gary for a job well done. Signup sheets were available at the meeting for the HDC meeting, Chuck Briegel's installation dinner and MVF work shifts. Kelly Meyer was the sergeant and collected \$57 in fines.
