## Dr. Bharat Motwani – Community Health Care Regional Virology Center



Dr. Bharat Motwani joined CHC in August 2005. Dr. Motwani practices in Infectious Diseases at the CHC Regional Virology Clinic. Dr. Motwani completed his M.B.B.S. (Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery) at Dr. Punjabrao Deshmukh Memorial Medical College in India . His postgraduate training includes completion of an Internal Medicine residency and an Infectious Diseases fellowship at Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science in Chicago

The River Drive Clinic is Community Health Care's largest medical clinic. Also the site of CHC's administrative offices, the clinic is located in downtown Davenport, Iowa, overlooking the beautiful Mississippi River. Serving 10,000 patients each year, the clinic offers preventive, acute and chronic care, including family practice, internal medicine, pediatrics, and obstetrics/ gynecology services. On-site ancillary services include radiology, laboratory, pharmacy, and health education, as well as Spanish and Vietnamese translation. The Homeless Outreach Team, based at the River Drive Clinic, also serves patients at drop-in clinics located throughout the community

The Community Health Care Dental Clinic, in downtown Davenport, Iowa, is conveniently located just across the street

from CHC's River Drive medical clinic. The Dental Clinic serves over 6,000 pediatric and adult patients each year. Preventive, acute, and restorative services are provided. Just as at CHC medical clinics, sliding fees are available for those who qualify

Community Health Care's Regional Virology Clinic opened in 1995. The Virology Clinic serves the HIV-infected populations in Scott County, Iowa and Rock Island County, Illinois and surrounding rural counties. Located on the west campus of Genesis Health System in Davenport, Iowa, the clinic offers testing, treatment, and counseling services as well as patient support groups. Staff members also provide outreach and education services throughout the community, to medical and educational professionals and students, and at drug treatment and youth rehabilitation facilities.

## **NOTE FROM ARTHUR CAMARA YOUTH EXCHANGE 2007-2008**

Hello Everyone! News from Brazil!

Just wanted to send this letter telling you guys how my year went back in Brazil and keep you updated with what is going on with me. Well. I must say this was a good year overall. I am studying Computer Science at UFMG, the Federal University of my state, considered one of the best in the country, and awarded as the best in Computer Science in 2009. I am glad and proud of having passed the entrance exams because the competition for a place in UFMG, as well as in any other Federal University is very tough. All Federal Universities are sponsored by the Federal Government, thus students don’t have any expense regarding tuition, enrollment or required materials. That means my family and I don’t spend a penny for my education. I finished my first year of college and even though it was hard to pass every class, I did fairly good and didn’t fail any.

In the beginning of the year, I also started working as an English teacher, in an English school. It’s a franchise with about 200 students and 16 employees. I only work about 15 hours per week, as I have to concentrate on my studies. I teach students of all ages and levels of knowledge and it’s good to still be in touch with the language and earn a little money.

My family is doing pretty good; my sister is now going to be a senior and my mom is still working a lot as usual. We will be having our Christmas celebration at my grandma’s with the whole family as we always do.

Well, I miss the United States and Iowa more than you can imagine and especially the people I met there! I always think of you guys and recall the moments that I lived with each one of you. I really wish I can be in America again and I’m eager to see you all. I’d love to visit the many friends I made around the world. After we become exchange students, we realize that nothing is worth more than living great moments, meeting great people and enjoying every single day regardless where you are.

### LAST WEEK – Anne Prinz, History of the Zither

Ms. Anne Prinz has been very fortunate to travel to Germany to learn how to repair and rebuild a Zither. She is very passionate about this Folk Instrument. The Zither was created by a genius in Germany. The instrument is similar to a guitar, and has 42 strings. The instruments went into people's attics during World War II, so many needed to be refurbished when they finally began to use them again. She recently finished rebuilding a small Zither that was 112 years old and had only 32 strings. New ones are only made in Germany.

A few years ago, the only thing known about the Zither in the Quad Cities, hung on the wall at the German Heritage Center. The picture was of the Davenport Zither Club, dating back to 1885. Much has changed since 2001, since several articles were published about the Zither and research was done. In 2005, the Heritage Center received a Zither to loan, for people to learn to play and take lessons. This was a very popular program and there are now 10 members of the QC Zither club. They get together often to practice. Only about 200 people in the United States play the Zither. It is a little tricky because you have to play 3 notes with 2 fingers.

Anne has traveled to Chicago to help with the local Zither club there, but Davenport remains the Zither capitol of the world. She has been contacted by a group of people on the East Coast that want to learn to play the Zither. There is a Zither exhibit on the third floor of the German Heritage Center in Davenport. Harlan says there are 12 Zithers on display. You don't need to be able to read music to play a Zither, so contact Anne if you want to learn to play. She teaches lessons and

loves to inform others about the wonderful Zither.
