He began his career in chamber management in 1988 in Rochester, MN later moving to Newton, IA where he served as President/CEO for three years before accepting his current position in March of 1994.

Rick is a 1995 graduate of the University of Colorado Institute for Organization Management, an active member of the American Chamber of Commerce Executives, Board member for the Illinois State Chamber Political Action Committee, past Chairman of the Illinois Association of Chamber of Commerce Executives (IACCE), and former Board member of the Illinois State Chamber of Commerce.

Rick was recently appointed to the Mississippi River Coordinating Council by Illinois Governor Pat Quinn.

Locally, Rick is Chairman of the Rock Island Community Foundation, Past Chairman of the Board of Directors for Robert Young Center for Community Mental Health and serves as a Board member for the Workforce Development Board, Adler Theater Foundation, Quad City Botanical Center, and New Ventures Center.

Tara Barney is President/CEO of the Iowa Quad Cities Chamber of Commerce, formerly, DavenportOne, a 1,200 member organization serving as the Chamber of Commerce for Davenport and Scott County, Iowa, as well as the economic development and downtown redevelopment entity for Davenport. She supervises a staff of 20 and reports to a 39 member Board of Directors comprised of CEO's representing all sectors of business. The organization was named 2008 Chamber of the Year by the American Chamber of Commerce Executives. She also serves as Co-CEO for Quad Cities First, the regional economic development sales and marketing organization.

In her previous position as Senior Vice President, Downtown Partnership, Tara led the downtown Davenport revitalization and development initiatives from August 2002 to February 2007. The Downtown Partnership is responsible for administration of the Downtown BID and for the judicious use of the voluntarily levied real estate tax increment within the district

Tara received her B.A. in Public Administration from Miami University, and her MPA from Ohio State University. She was the recipient of the School of Business Administration Pace Setter Award. She currently serves on the Board of Trustees of the American Chamber of Commerce Executives, Figge Art Museum, the Scott County YMCA and Davenport Rotary.

As I am sure most of you remember, District 6000 and District 5970 applied for and received a Rotary International Public Relations Grant for this Rotary Year, 2009-10. The time for the grant to be enacted has arrived and the Public Relation Chairs for these two districts are putting the finishing touches on the grant.

The following are opportunities that District 6000 Rotarians will have because of the grant:

1. Rotarians on IPTV during Festival.

District 6000 and 5970 need to have 40 Rotarians at the IPTV production center in Johnston, Iowa, March 9, to answer the phones for IPTV during that evening of FESTIVAL. Volunteers will be asked to be at the center by 5:30 pm for training and food, and will be expected to remain there until 11:00 pm. Rotarians will answer the phones for IPTV during this time. You are asked to wear Rotary apparel so you can be recognized during the programming breaks. If you or members of your club want to be part of this program, call Carolyn at the District 6000 office, 877-976-8279, and give her your name and contact information. IPTV will be notifying you of the expectations for the event.

Rotarians are asked to notify Carolyn of their intent to participate, before February 24, so we will have time to send your information to IPTV by the end of the month. Participants will be selected on a first come basis, if there are more who want to join us than we have space.

2. Rotary on IPTV

15 second "Humanity in Motion" segments are being aired on IPTV. These segments are aired around, "*Iowa Press*", "*Newshour with Jim Lehrer*", "*Nightly Business Report*", and "*Nova*". I have heard from Rotarians that they have been seeing the segments, and that they were very nicely done.

3. Rotary on Mediacom.

The 30 minute program featuring Rotary is in the final stages of production. The program will feature Rotary International programs as well as individual programs from District 6000 and 5970. The program also features segments by Former Governor Robert D Ray, and Former First Lady Christie Vilsack. The program will air on Mediacom at the following times:
