LAST WEEK – MARIA LEVETZOW BETTENDORF PUBLIC LIBRARY

Seventy five members and guests attended Rotary on Friday, March 5, 2010. Ms. Maria Levetzow, an employee of the Bettendorf Public Library since 1992, told about some very interesting programs at her library. Maria is the library's Adult and Information Services manager. Previous to 2007, she was the teen librarian. At that time Bettendorf had the only dedicated teen librarian in the state of Iowa. Maria has developed teen reading programs and authored 5 nationally distributed program manuals promoting teen literature.

Maria informed the club about the new automated check in system of materials at her library. The 170,000 items in the library each have a coded tag, RFID, radio frequency information, which allow a scanner to send the item to the correct sorting basket. This method eliminates a lot of time of handling the items and damage that items receive when returned in a book drop. Items are returned to the shelves and ready for checkout, the same day they are returned. Before it was sometimes, 3-4 days. The new RFID system is the first in the Quad Cities. It cost about \$250,000 and was paid for by grants. It eliminates human error and is a no touch, fast and gentle system to sort returned items.

Guests present were Bev Smith, guest of Jim Smith and Pam White, guest of (absent) Rob White. The big surprise of the day was the Davenport Chord Busters quartet, Possible Side

Effects, surprising Dorothy White with a long stem rose and serenading her, as Sweetheart of the Year.

Chuck encouraged officers to attend the District Assembly in Ankeny, IA on Saturday, March 27. This is a free function; you just need to register with the District office. Also the District Conference will be April 23-25, in Burlington, IA. More information is available at the meetings. Early registration ends April 2, and is \$100 per person until that date.
