You have no idea how pleased & surprised I was at Rotary on March 5th. You went to a tremendous amount of work to plan such a complimentary affair.

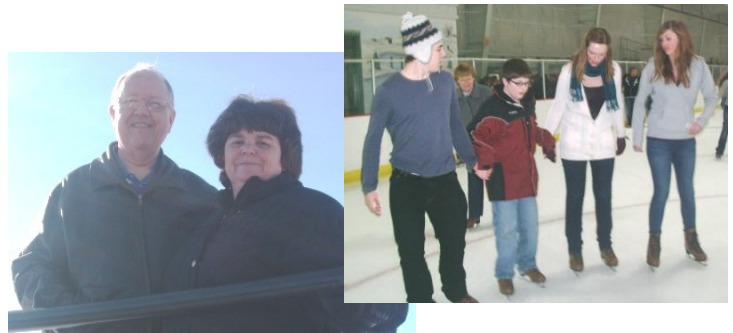
It was good to be back in the swing of things and I don’t intend to take such an extended vacation again for a long time. A trillion thanks, Dorothy

LAST WEEK – Kristen Veto Meeting Planner – John Deere Pavilion

Seventy one members and guests attended Rotary last Friday. James and Margo had to get a last minute program, as the scheduled one had a family emergency. Kristen Veto, Meeting Planner with the John Deere Pavilion in Moline did a wonderful job and we were very grateful to her. Kristen has been with the John Deere Pavilion for four years. Kristen previously was the coordinator of Group Tours and Customer Visits at the Pavilion. She worked closely with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau to coordinate International and Domestic tour groups.

Kristen now is in charge of the Children's Education at the pavilion. She teaches groups of children where the foods they eat come from. She works with a wooden cow, to demonstrate milking. She also has a video about global issues and shows seeds with the end product that they produce. A very popular item is the hatching of baby chickens in the spring. The third Saturday of every month she holds a kids craft day at the Pavilion from 10 AM to 4 PM.

The John Deere Pavilion opened in 1997 and has had over 2 million visitors since opening day. In 2009, it had over 50 international groups with over 3000 guests.

The only two guests present were Drake Fuller, grandson of Dick Cole and Jaime Alfonzo Ruiz, Youth Exchange student from Spain. Dennis Peterson gave a brief financial report,

representing the committee, and announced the scholarship amounts for this year. Other committee reports given were: John Maxwell on Literacy, Kelly Meyer on Special Olympics, and Paul Kalainoff on GSE Team. Chuck encouraged members to sign up and participate in the upcoming District events in April.

Teresa Paper told about the "Special" Paul Harris Awards Day to be held May 7, during the regular meeting time. This is being planned by her Foundation Committee and the New Ideas Committee, chaired by Jan Trimble. Anyone who would like special recognition at this meeting will need to donate enough money by Friday, March 26 to bring their Paul Harris balance to the next level.
