Help President Elect Charlie Jones Plan for his year as our President



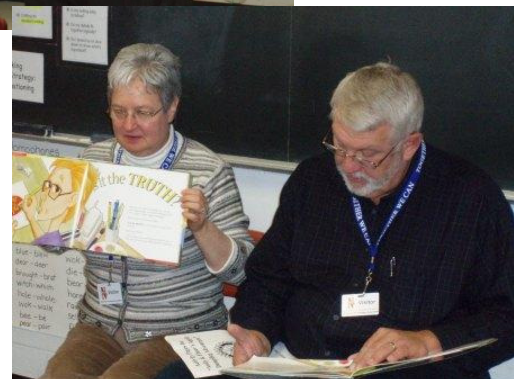
2010-2011
