The PHS recognizes Rotarians and friends when they have contributed \$1000 to the Annual Programs Fund, Polio Plus, Polio Plus Partners or the Humanitarian Grants Program. The first PHS was established in 1998 in District 5340 (California) and gained momentum and spread to districts throughout the world. The trustees of The Rotary Foundation officially approved the PHS as a district-administered recognition program, effective July 1, 2006.
