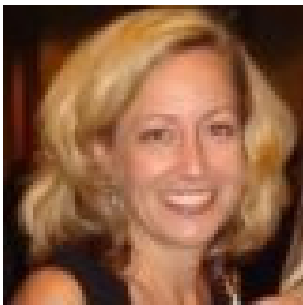

CLAIR PETERSON, CHAIRMAN JOHN DEERE GOLF CLASSIC

Sixty one members and a guest, Joe Hutter with the Bettendorf News and a member of the Scott County Extension Service Board, were present at the North Scott Rotary meeting on Friday, April 30. Becky Bray gave the invocation and Jody Johnston-Mohr led the singing. Jeff Helms was the greeter and Kelly Meyer was the sergeant of arms.

Clair Peterson, Chairman of the John Deere Classic Golf Tournament was the guest speaker. He was introduced by Bill Tubbs. Clair & Bill both graduated from Iowa State University with a degree in journalism. This is the 40th year that the Quad Cities has sponsored a PGA tour. It takes 1500 volunteers to run the event. This event brings a lot of revenue to the QC, from players and their families' spending money to eat and stay here. The golf tournament gave money to 494 charities last year through donations to the Birdies for Charity Partner Program.

In 2008 the program purchased a jet so that they could shuttle players to the British Open which follows the John Deere Classic. These close dates had always been a problem for the golfers and many chose to skip the QC tournament due to scheduling conflicts. Clair says that the good players come back, which makes his job a little easier. Several larger cities have cancelled major golfing events dues to the lack of a

sponsor. The QC is lucky, as the sponsorship with John Deere has been renewed to 2016.

Jeremy Kaiser urged members to volunteer to help with the Putnam Museum Adventure on May 26. Five Rotary clubs total will bring 500 underprivileged children (in two shifts) to a fun evening & light meal at the Museum. Charlie Jones asked members to turn in a committee sheet or you will be put on Harlan's can detail (a new fund raiser).

Bert Vigen and the scholarship committee met before the regular meeting to choose this year's winners. They will be identified and invited to the Youth Meeting on May 14. Dr. Anita Wubbena is again taking orders for Rotary shirts, hats, etc. If you are interested, see her this month (May).
