Shelter Box USA

Four months after the earthquake in Haiti -- amid the chaos and devastation, a green box still remains a symbol of hope. This was ever more evident when a patient, who was being cared for with Project Medishare, asked for help in finding shelter for their family. As a household name in Haiti, ShelterBox was the first organization they knew they could call. Each iconic green box contains a 10-person tent, water purification, basic tools and survival items that assist victims of natural disasters and other catastrophic events.

On Saturday, May 8, 2010, the executive director of ShelterBox USA, Veronica Brandon Miller, along with two ShelterBox Response Team Members, Alan Monroe and Steve Tonkinson, accompanied the Miami Dolphins alumni Bobby Harden, Sean Hill and Bryant Salter, and representatives from Sun Life Financial and Project Medishare to Port-au-Prince to provide ShelterBoxes to 13 patients and their families.

“Collaboration is the lifeline of any organization,” said Brandon-Miller, “and in this particular case, ShelterBox values this partnership with Medishare, Sun Life Financial, and the Miami Dolphins to send 13 ShelterBox tents and life-saving equipment to help 13 extended families in the aftermath of the earthquake in Haiti.”

One of the recipients, who was a patient with Project Medishare’s field hospital for weeks and had her leg amputated, was grateful to receive the much needed aid.

“What you are doing only God can pay you back because you all got together to save the nation and I thank you very much,” she said through an interpreter.

As the first organization on the ground to provide shelter to the distressed nation of Haiti, ShelterBox has already provided enough aid for over 150,000 people and continues to supply aid and resources to reach its goal of providing enough aid to shelter one fifth of those displaced by the devastating earthquake.

Notes on Rotary Meeting – June 4, 2010

Seventy members and guests heard all about the Honor Flight program in the Quad Cities, on Friday. Guests present were Bob Olds, guest of Jim Smith, Diane Koster, guest of Anita Wubbena and Pete DeCook, guest of Bill Tubbs. Bob Morrison, speaker, is the volunteer Hub Director of the Honor Flight of the Quad Cities and an employee of Ridgecrest Village as the Development Director. Eight flights have gone to Washington D.C. since November 2008.

Bob is a Davenport Rotarian and works with the main Honor Flight location in Springfield, Ohio. He helped some Veterans sign up for the trip and found out that it would be years until they were able to go, because of the waiting list. That is when he started a Quad City program. Terminally ill veterans, with a doctor's excuse, get to the top of the list. The youngest World War II veteran is 81 years old. Some may not live long enough to go on the trip. Six more trips are being planned for June, September and November. Each veteran goes free of charge. The guardians pay \$550 each and help the veterans get around. Many donations are received on behalf of the veterans. Some of the past donors have been: Runge Mortuary, Ridgecrest Village, Modern Woodmen and Riverboat Development. Sun Country Charter planes are the only airline they use.

This is a very moving experience for the veterans and guardians. Bert Vigen and Jeff Ashcraft have both been

on a trip. Jeff said it was a very meaningful experience and he would recommend it to anyone that can come up with the \$550.

June birthdays were celebrated and \$26 was collected for the educational fund. Jeff Ashcraft was the sergeant and collected \$43 in fines. Three weeks ago when Dr. Anita was the sergeant, she added \$50 to the education fund, as a donation from the pink hat auction. Andy and Elmer books are still on sale for \$10 each until they are gone. Teresa Paper reported that the club is ahead of goal of money given to the Foundation for this Rotary year. Merle Anderson asked for GSE leader applications and helpers for the John Deere Classic Golf Tournament July 5-11, 2010. John Maxwell sold the JDC tickets that we received from the Birdies for Charity donation. They sold for a total of \$560. Charlie Jones told about the installation dinner on July 8. Chuck mentioned that Nancy Glawe is recovering fine and expects to return to Rotary soon. Deb Hughes had some shoulder surgery and also expects to return soon.
