### **J. B. Young Steel Band**

During the 1930's steel drums evolved and were eventually made from 55-gallon oil barrels on the islands of Trinidad and Tobago. These are relatively new instruments to the United States. In 1957 Rear Admiral Dan Gallery, USN ret. (1901-1977) established the Navy Steel Band and in the 1960's more bands were formed in the United States.

The Davenport Community Schools received a grant from the Scott County Regional Authority and Quad City Arts to purchase two complete steel bands. We just finished the first school year with a steel band at J.B. Young Intermediate School and one at Central High School. We are in the beginning stages of starting the Davenport Community Schools steel bands. The steel bands are open to any student regardless of musical knowledge.

The J.B. Young Steel Band will be performing their first "gig" for the North Scott Rotary on July 9<sup>th</sup>, led by instructor and DCSD Band Director Monike Hill. This band is comprised of mostly 6<sup>th</sup> graders and many of them did not know how to read music eight months ago. Even the students who are in band, orchestra or chorus had to learn how to play these new and exciting instruments and read the music. Our band consists of the following four main steel drums or pans: tenor/lead pan, double second/alto pans, cello pans and bass pans. We must also have the "engine room" which includes rhythm instruments like shakers, drums and small percussion instruments. The most important instrument in the engine room is the iron, which is actually a brake drum from a car.

## YOUNG PROFESSIONALS SOUGHT FOR ROTARY GOODWILL EXCHANGE TO AUSTRALIA

Iowa Rotarians seek four outstanding young professionals, ages 25-40, to be part of a Group Study Exchange to Australia from Feb. 26 to March 26, 2010.

Rotary District 6000 will send a team of four non-Rotarians, plus a Rotarian team leader, to a district in southeast Australia. The purpose of GSE is to promote international understanding and goodwill through person-to-person contact. While abroad, team members stay in Rotarians' homes, give presentations, meet their professional counterparts, and experience the host country's customs, vocations and lifestyles.

Our selection committee is looking for exemplary ambassadors of their country, state and profession. Team members should have strong communication skills, experience working in a team and ability to cope in an unfamiliar environment over 30 often arduous days. International travel experience is a plus.

Here are answers to basic questions about the exchange:

**WHO'S ELIGIBLE?** Participants must be employed full-time in a recognized business or profession, and live or be employed in Rotary District 6000, which comprises most of the southern Iowa south of Highway 30, including Ames, Marshalltown and Clinton (but not Cedar Rapids).

**WHERE'S THE EXCHANGE?** Team members will travel to District 9790 near Melbourne (portions of eastern Victoria and southern New South Wales). For more information on the district, see [www.rotary9790.org.au](http://www.rotary9790.org.au).

**WHO PAYS FOR THE TRIP?** The Rotary International Foundation provides a round-trip air ticket, and local Rotarians in the host communities provide meals, lodging and group travel. Team members pay for personal and incidental expenses, including passports.

**HOW DO I APPLY?** Applications are available from a local Rotary Club president; the GSE outbound committee chairman Lynn Hicks, (515) 556-0747 or [lynhyx@gmail.com](mailto:lynhyx@gmail.com); or the Rotary district web page at [www.rotary6000.org](http://www.rotary6000.org) (Look on the left side under "Foundation" and "Group Study Exchange") **Completed applications must be endorsed by the sponsoring clubs and submitted to Hicks by Aug. 14, 2009.** All applicants must be available for an interview on the weekend of Aug. 29-30 to qualify for this award.

**WHO LEADS THE TRIP?** Rita Perea of the Greater Des Moines Emerging Leaders Rotary Club was chosen as team leader. She will assist in the selection and preparation of team members.
