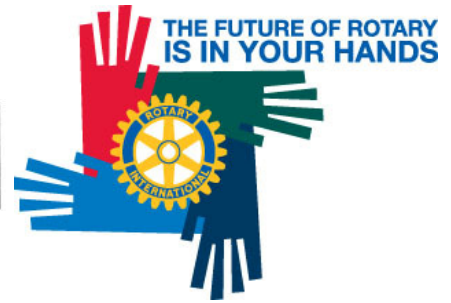

is currently recruiting adult volunteers to serve as Lunch Buddies to children at a nearby elementary school.

We all remember someone other than our parents who took a little moment and transformed it into a big experience. We idolized adults who took an interest in us, singled us out and helped us gain new experiences and learn new skills.

Our School-based Program, *Lunch Buddies*, is a one-to-one mentoring program that matches a LITTLE, a child between the ages of 6 and 12, with a BIG, an adult volunteer. The match meets twice each month during lunch at the school (minimum: 1 visit every other week). Volunteer commitment is between 35 and 50 minutes every other week- a lunch hour! BIG's visit their LITTLE at school and help with homework, play board games, read books, talk and even go out to recess.

A fellow North Scott Rotarian, Kim Wilkins had the following to say about his experience this past year as a school-based volunteer:

I have been a "Big" for a little over a year now to a little boy J.J. We hit it off right away. He would hug me when we first met, and occasionally after that. That always made a big impression on me. He had been new to this area and had trouble making friends and doing school work. Shortly after we met, he began making lots of friends. Everyone would say 'hi' to him in the hallways as we walked, or out on the playground. He was playing well most of the time with the other students. His home life leaved a lot to be desired and was affecting his schoolwork, but at the end of the school year, he seemed to be improving and was anxious to show me what he was doing in school. It's sometimes hard to figure out who benefits the most from the relationship- him or I.

RAY WOLF: National Weather Service

Ray Wolf, Operations Officer with the National Weather Service in Mt. Joy, Iowa was the speaker on Friday. He stated that climate change is a science issue. Ray has been in Iowa since 1994. He has worked in Denver, CO as a forecaster and in Mississippi as an agricultural forecaster.

Ray told about the weather changes and the impact that they will have on Midwest agriculture. The growing season will be longer which will provide the potential for increased crop yields. However, the possibility arises for heat waves, floods, droughts, insects and weeds that will present challenges with crops and livestock.
