Walter W. Fahrenkrog, 77, of Eldridge passed away Thursday, Sept. 10, 2009, at Genesis Medical Center, East Campus. Funeral services were at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, Sept. 14, at the Runge Mortuary, Davenport. Visitation was 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 13 at the mortuary. Burial was in Davenport Memorial Park Cemetery.

Memorials may be made to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International for Polio Eradication, or Faith Lutheran Church, Eldridge.

Walter was born Sept. 27, 1931 in Davenport, Iowa, the son of Frank and Gertrude (Koch) Fahrenkrog. He was united in marriage to Phyllis E. Steward September 29, 1951. She preceded him in death Oct. 2, 1978. He later married Janet K. Swanson Trippoli May 3, 1980 in Eldridge, Iowa.

Walt was a veteran of the United States Army, serving in the Korean War.

He was a self-employed CPA in Eldridge, operating as Walter W. Fahrenkrog CPA for over 45 years.

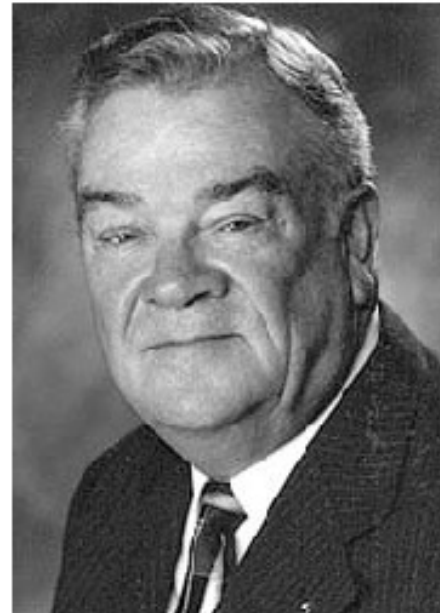
Walter was Past Commander of Donahue American Legion No. 532; treasurer of Miracles for Military; past president of Springbrook Country Club, DeWitt; past president, treasurer, and had perfect attendance for 34 years with the North Scott Rotary Club; past president, Eastern Iowa Chapter of CPAs; past vice chairman, Davenport Osteopathic Hospital; past president of Riverside Foundry Credit Union; past chairman of the board, Osteopathic Foundation of the Quad Cities; treasurer of the North Scott Rotary Educational Foundation and treasurer of the Davenport Quarterback Club. He served 18 years with the Town Council and Volunteer Fire Department of Donahue, Iowa. Other memberships include: Loyal Order of the Moose Lodge 28, Davenport; Elks Lodge 298; Iowa Society of CPAs; American Institute of CPAs; and VFW.

Those left to honor his memory include: his wife, Janet, Eldridge; children, Debra Hughes, Davenport; Sandra (Paul) VenHorst, Bettendorf; Audrey Hein, Davenport; Steven (Tammy) Fahrenkrog, Eldridge; 12 grandchildren, Cynthia Hughes-Anliker, Rebecca Hughes, Amy Leone, Stacy, Tricia, Megan, and Kelsey VenHorst, Grant, Owen and Paige Fahrenkrog, Stephanie and Erin Valentine; great grandson, Ethan Hughes.

He was preceded in death by his parents, wife, Phyllis, grandson, Kyle Valentine, and a brother, Vernon Fahrenkrog.

In all that Walt thought, said and did, he lived Rotary's Four-Way Test, keeping accurate records of finances for his clients, the Rotary club and the many organizations he served.

In a past president's "Centennial Minute" reflection at Rotary in May 2005, he said, "Thank you, Rotary, for 30 years!" He recalled a dancing girl with balloons who came to Rotary on his 50th birthday. "Nothing has been the same since," he said. "All dignity and decorum was lost!"

He valued the service work of Rotary both in the local community and internationally. He recalled special Rotary trips: Kaiserslautern, Germany, and the Rotary International Convention in Dallas. He urged members to attend a Rotary International Convention if they have the opportunity.

Though it was not widely known, Walt was a polio survivor and was among the first to embrace our organization's global quest to eradicate this disease. He was among the first and most generous contributors of our club to PolioPlus.
