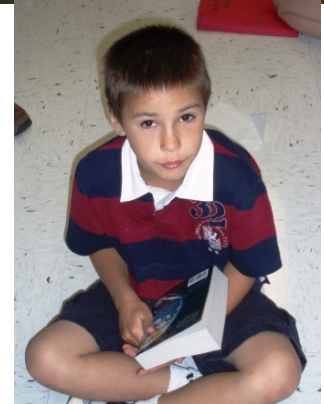
NEW MEMBERS PROPOSED
