## Kate Cuellar - Regional Director American Heart Association

Kate Cuellar is currently the Regional Director of the Quad Cities chapter of the American Heart Association. She chose this career because of her love of helping others and more importantly the impact heart disease has played in her own life.

Kate grew up never knowing her grandfather, who died at age 56 of a massive heart attack. When her own father died at age 55, she assumed heart disease was a death sentence. She chose to volunteer for the American Heart Association, hoping that she could help to save the lives of her 3 younger brothers. Through volunteering, she learned that heart disease does not have to be a death sentence and that not only were her brothers at risk, but because heart disease is the #1 killer of men AND women, she too was at risk.

After 5 years of volunteer work with the American Heart Association's Heart Walk and Go Red for Women Luncheon, she signed on as the organization's Regional Director. Shortly after becoming a staff member, she practiced what she preached and went to her family physician with strange symptoms. She was diagnosed with heart disease and is working hard to make sure this is

something she is living with and not dying from. She, her brother and 3-month old nephew are all surviving different types of heart disease and know their efforts in awareness and fundraising will help to build healthier lives, free of cardiovascular diseases and stroke.

### LAST WEEK – AMY JOHANNSEN Scott County Watershed Coordinator

Ms. Amy Johannsen and the Scott County Soil & Water Conservation District have a great mission. They want to educate and implement ways all citizens can improve watershed. They also would like to see soil quality restoration. Iowa previously had twelve inches of good top soil, now most places have only four inches. New development areas have none.

The first project Amy was involved with after she came to work for Scott County in 2007, was the Davenport North High School Storm Water Mitigation Project. Every time it rained, alot of water sat in front of the school. Large areas were dug up, and alot of rock was used to divert the water to Candlelight Creek. Now no water sits there longer than 24 hours.

Some other projects Amy is involved with are the Fairmount Habitat Project, Earth Week Fair, Bald Eagle Days, EcoKids – Creek Stomping, and the Scott County wide water sampling. She also has assisted in the building of two rain gardens at Habitat Houses.

Teresa Paper introduced Scott Community College scholarship winners, Jodi Pranschke and Rebecca Hupp. They are both non traditional scholarship winners and are both enrolled in the nursing program at Scott. They each told a little about themselves and why they entered nursing now. Other guests of
