FRIDAY—AT THE STEEPLEGATE

Kevin Kellums

Family Enrichment Center
Executive director



Kevin Kellums is the executive director of a new nonprofit center in Goose Creek Heights (formerly Americana Park) in north Davenport. Mr. Kellums began forming the Family Enrichment Center of Davenport (FEC) nearly 4 years ago while involved in youth work. After working with teenagers and families for approximately 15 years in various capacities, Kevin has formed the vision and strategy of FEC, which is aimed at providing a continual system of supportive programs within a given neighborhood. The goal is to break the cycle and patterns of poverty that perpetuate within low income neighborhoods and change

the outcomes from the inside-out. While working with families over the past several years, Kevin has seen many well intentioned programs produce limited results. Often the programs are disconnected and in low income communities, accessibility is a major issue. FEC will begin its first phase of programming with early education (Najuna – meaning new life in a Ugandan dialect) and Cutting Edge (CE) Parents. FEC has been working with the Davenport Public Schools to utilize the same curriculum and provide excellent teaching staff for its early education, and the CE Parent program is required for every parent/guardian with a child enrolled in Najuna. As FEC builds a base of support and strong outcomes from phase I, they will implement; after-school, job coaching and college preparation programs. FEC uses an outcomes measurement logic model, similar to United Way, for each of its programs. As FEC gains success in Goose Creek, they will look at applying this same strategy in other high needs neighborhoods.
