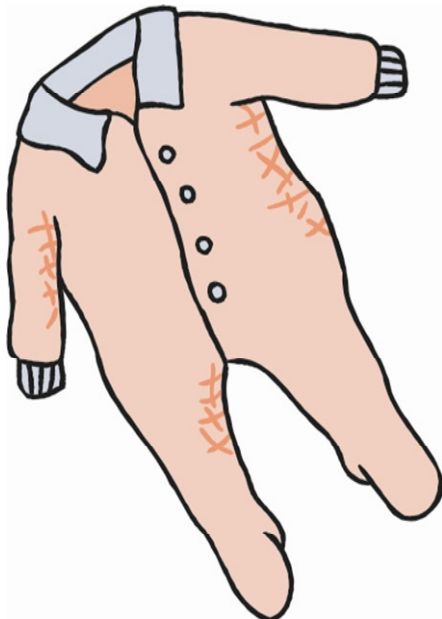

KEVIN KELLUMS – Family Enrichment Center of Davenport

Kevin Kellums, executive director of the FEC, has his work cut out for him. His organization is working to fight poverty from the inside out. Programs are intentionally creating continual support for individuals/families from birth through adulthood. The FEC reaches beyond typical at-risk programs to include a focus on impacting the neighborhood environment. The FEC's goal is to create a continuous, uninterrupted system of support for children and families in the north Davenport area.

Kevin states that poverty effects one of every six children in the Davenport Community School District. He works primarily in the Goose Creek area of Davenport, formerly known as Americana Heights. The crime rate is very high in this area. He hopes to open a full time daycare and preschool in this area so that the parents are available to gain employment.

Students were present on Friday, from Davenport Assumption High School. They were Mark Steinhauser from Bettendorf and Becka Otting from Davenport. Nancy Glawe introduced them, as well as their counselor, Julie Fulton. Mark is a member of the National Honor Society and Chess Club. He volunteers at Bethany Home for Children & Families and also works at Lagomarcino's. Becka is also in the National Honor Society and Chess Club, as well as Art Club and plays Volleyball.

Merle Anderson introduced a very special guest, Julie Stevens

from Andrew, Iowa. She has been selected to be a member of the Group Study Exchange Team that will travel to Australia in March or April 2010. The North Scott Rotary Club is her sponsoring club. She is employed by Northeast Iowa Community College and has an education in Grape/Wine and Landscape Architecture.

Other guests present were Rotarians Bill Cameron from the Keokuk club and Brian Dockery from the Moline club. Also, Dr. Fred Green, guest of Glenn Eakes and Sarah Kautz, guest of Jeremy Kaiser.
