Steven Bahls – President: Augustana College

Fifty eight members and guests were present on Friday to hear Steven Bahls give a wealth of information about Augustana, past and present. Steve is a Rock Island Rotarian and said that North Scott Rotary has a reputation for having the best piano player in the world and a “fun” club. He is extremely proud of the Viking men’s basketball team at Augustana, which is #3 in the nation with an 18-0 record this year.

Augustana College was 150 years old on June 5, 2010. Its first language in 1860 was Swedish. Forty percent of the incoming students today are coming into the science and/or pre med program. Students come from all seven continents of the World. The music department excels and so does the debate team. (They can’t be beat!) Forty per cent of the students are Catholic and twenty per cent are Lutheran. Augustana College is considered the Elite College on the Hill.

Current enrollment at Augustana is about 2500 students, with tuition exceeding \$40,000 per year.
