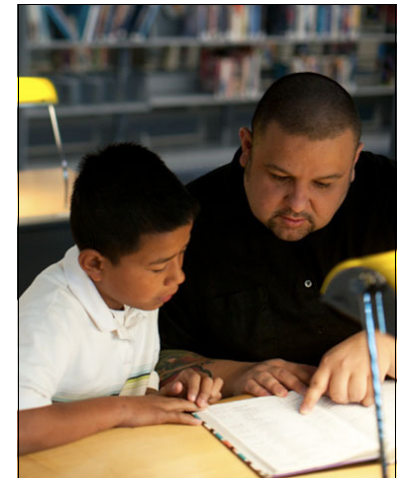

Dear President Charlie & North Scott Rotary members;

Thank you for the recent generous gift of \$169 in cash and \$400 in clothing collected at the recently combined Rotary Clubs Annual Pajama Party to benefit the Family Resources Quad Cities Domestic Violence Shelter and Victim Services Program.

During this past year, we provided help to 13,475 victims of domestic violence. Our two domestic shelters located in Muscatine and Davenport provided safe harbor to a record number of 352 women and children who needed to escape from their abusers. Most of these women and children come to us unable to bring anything with them such as extra clothes, personal care items or even a favorite toy for the children. While at the shelter for up to 90 days (free of any charges) they receive not only the safety and security of a warm bed and good food but additional services such as medical care, legal advocacy, counseling, and assistance in finding a new job and resetting into a new and safe permanent place to live.

With help such as yours, survivors of domestic violence know that there are people in our community who care, wish for them healing, and assure them that there is a better life and a hopeful future ahead.
