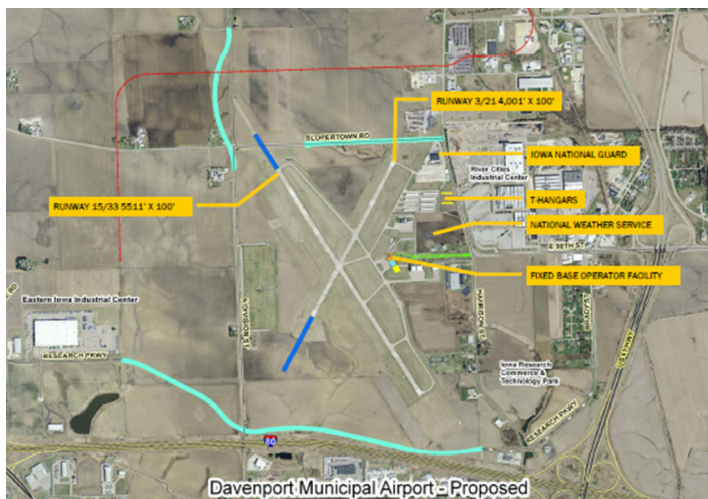

The City of Davenport owns and operates the Davenport Municipal Airport. The airport provides a wide variety of services and activities to the community. You can learn to fly, take a sight-seeing tour, charter a private aircraft, or just bring the family out to watch a plane or helicopter take-off.

The airport is also home to the award winning Quad City Air Show, the Iowa Air National Guard, Civil Air Patrol, Carver Aero, the National Weather Service, and the local Sprint Kart Speedway. We are fortunate to be served by a full service Fixed Base Operator (FBO) and to have T-hangars available for lease with access to self serve fuel.

The airport is key to promoting commerce in the City of Davenport. About 300 corporate jets from around the country arrive each year. In sum, the services and

activities provided by the Davenport Municipal Airport support nearly 400 employment opportunities and generate nearly \$20 million in local spending annually.

Meeting Notes: March 11, 2011 Kim Crosby & Emily Jepsen: Big Brothers/Big Sisters

Kim and Emily are very enthusiastic about the Big Brothers Big Sisters programs. They are truly dedicated to changing the life of a child in our community. There are 1300 matches every year. 450 new matches have been made so far this year. They offer two different programs. One is the community based program, which requires a 6 hour per month commitment. A big gets matched with a little and you do activities that you both enjoy. These can be going to a sports event, going on a bike ride or attending a movie. The other program is the school based program. You meet 2-4 times a month at the little's school and eat lunch together and possibly go out to recess. You can just talk, read books or help with homework.

To get into the program you must first fill out the inquiry form. If accepted, you attend a group orientation and enter a group match session. You are expected to build a relationship with the child you are matched with. The child "little" is assigned to only one adult "big". The only exception is that a couple is allowed to work together with a little. Kim Wilkins and Adam Kerns both have a little brother. Both programs are a one year

commitment.

Sixty two members and guests attended on Friday and enjoyed the first Lenten buffet. Guests present were Andrew Mulch, son of Fred Mulch and Mark Huse, Rhythm City Casino, guest of Becky Bray.
