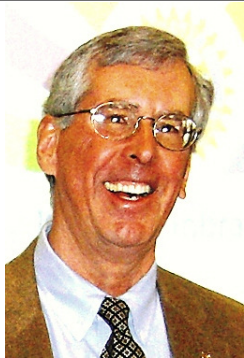

Governor Gary Welch writes: Dear Rotarians

We have all witnessed the horrible devastation caused by the earthquake and resulting tsunami that hit Japan last week. Obviously, we all want to step forward and assist. No doubt many of you are wondering how best to help. In anticipation of those inquiries I am sending out this letter.

As most of you know, Rotary is at its best in helping with regard to medium and longer term recovery following a disaster. Long after the emergency teams have gone home, Rotary remains involved and in fact steps up its efforts focusing on how best to rebuild the communities affected. We are the ones that will be in it for the long haul, since we have Rotarians living in those hard hit communities.

I am sure as time passes we will hear the stories of the hardships encountered not just by these communities, but by our own fellow Rotarians.

Many of you may recall the devastation experienced by Sri Lanka following the last major tsunami. However, this devastation was followed by some amazing long-term work from the Sri Lankan Rotarians as they drove the rebuilding efforts for 20 elementary schools in Sri Lanka.

I urge each of you to make certain that there is a balance to the giving by all involved. We need to make certain that we provide immediate help and we also must make certain that Rotary is able to help our own Japanese clubs rebuild their communities. After all it is all about building communities and bridging continents.

In response to the disaster in Japan, District 6000 is setting up a line item through our Humanitarian Fund to deposit donations for Japan's recovery. I would ask each of you to give to this fund to assist our fellow Rotarians' recovery in Japan.

Brock Earnhardt retired in 2009 as President of Iowa American Water Company after a 42-year career in the public water utility business in eight states, the last 23 years in Iowa. Brock is a member and past president of the Rotary Club of Davenport and a past assistant governor of District 6000 and co-chair of District Conference that was held at the Steeplegate Inn and Mississippi Valley Fairgrounds in Davenport in 2005. He presently serves his Rotary district as District Grants Subcommittee Chair and as a board member of District 6000 Humanitarian and Education Foundation and FAMSCO, the Rotary-affiliated not-for-profit that secures fire engines, ambulances and medical supplies and facilitates their delivery to poor communities in developing countries. He serves his home community as a volunteer in several not-profit organizations.

In November 2010, Brock joined a team of Rotarians in northern Nigeria where they participated in polio immunization days and looked at projects that included the Rotary Foundation Matching Grant funded in part by North Scott Rotary at the

Meeting Notes: March 18, 2011 Dale Hendricks & Jeremy Keiting: Davenport Municipal Airport

Dale started out by showing a night landing or IFR (instrument flight rules) landing which he has completed over eighty such flights. The Davenport Municipal Airport offers enhanced service and serves as an economic engine for Davenport.

245 people are employed at the airport. A lot are part time. The airports at Ankeny, Boone and Council Bluffs have employment equal to the Davenport airport. A lot of improvements have been made to the airport in the recent months. A new 20,000 square foot hanger and a 7800 square foot office have been built. There also is a public meeting area that can be reserved for use.

The Air Show, held yearly, has increased attendance from 2700 the first year to 100,000 in recent years. It is rated as one of the top three air shows held. An extended runway has been approved and is in the five year plan. But first, some major road work has to be done to Buttermilk Road.

Jeremy, Airport Manager, spoke briefly, after Dale. He came to work for the Airport from California. He is

originally from the Midwest, so the cold is not bothering him too much. He has worked in airport operations for ten years and is overseeing the expansion project.

Sixty one members and guests attended on Friday. Guests present were Mark Huse and Daryl Moore, both guests of Becky Bray. Becky presided over the business meeting and encouraged members to register for the district conference and sign up to help with the Special Olympics. Angela Reese told about the "Service above Self" Rotary Blood Drive on April 14-15 and Keith Mattke talked about the disaster in Japan.

Dr. Anita told about the new member orientation that she is planning on April 1. She also mentioned the self defense class being held on April 7 at South Park Mall. (See the calendar for details.) Mike Brown invited members to view the completed dispatch center on Sunday and Steve Suiter mentioned that Henrietta Cahill is hospitalized at Genesis East.
