Jordan L. Cohen was appointed Interim Vice President for Research at the University of Iowa in March of 2008, and Vice President for Research and Economic Development in October of 2010, after serving 8 years as Dean of the College of Pharmacy here and 11 ½ years in a similar capacity at the University of Kentucky.

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, he received his B.S. in pharmacy in 1965 and Ph.D. in pharmaceuticals and analytical chemistry in 1969 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He served on the faculty at the University of Southern

California for almost 18 years where his research focused on clinical pharmacology of anticancer and anti-aids agents and drug disposition in the elderly.

Currently, he has interests in leadership issues in the health professions and the effects of the changes in health care delivery on health professions education and research.

Dr. Cohen is a Fellow of the American Association of Pharmaceutical Sciences and the American Pharmaceutical Association's Academy of Pharmaceutical Research. He was elected to the United States Pharmacopeia (USP) Board of Trustees In 1990, and served as Chair from 1995-2000 and currently serves as the USP member of the AMA's adopted drug names council. He has been active in state and regional economic development activities in both Kentucky and Iowa and served on the Bioscience Alliance committee of the Iowa Department of Economic Development and the Board of Directors for both Priority One and the Iowa City Area Development Group.

Meeting Notes: March 25, 2011

Brock Earnhardt:

International Water Project

Brock Earnhardt, Davenport Rotarian, was a part of Project Safari – Nigeria 2010. He travelled with a group of other Rotarians, from Iowa and Illinois. While there he helped administer polio drops to children and viewed the water projects that Rotary has actively been involved with. He had the opportunity to stay in homes of local Rotarians and also in hotels and even a hospital wing.

Nigeria was almost polio free in 2000, and then the country leaders decided that the vaccinations were unsafe. The immunizations stopped for several years. Now, since they have been given again for a few years, only 388 cases were reported in 2009 and only 21 cases in 2010. He had pictures of the polio stricken people crawling on the ground, only a few have wheel chairs. Only one eye clinic serves the whole area.

Clean, sanitary water is also a problem. Rotary is drilling wells to help prevent further outbreak of

diseases. Raw sewage flows along the streets. There are five toilets for 3000 people. North Scott and Northeast Des Moines Rotary clubs gave money in addition to the District designated funds for the water projects in Nigeria.

Sixty five people attended on Friday. Guests present were: Daryl Moore, guest of Becky Bray, Mary Anne Braden, Carrie Kilen and Victoria Hawley, all from North Scott Schools. Carrie is the daughter of Dan & Kathy Kilen. She is involved in volleyball, basketball, soccer, National Honor Society, FCA and student government. Victoria is the daughter of John & Kim Hawley. She is active in softball, basketball, student government and various church activities. Both girls plan to attend a four year college.

Dr. Anita was the sergeant of arms and collected \$66 in fines. All the upcoming events were mentioned and sign ups were encouraged. These events can all be viewed on the calendar of events. Sheila Volrath told that Otto Sender is in Manor Care. Jerry Hansen had a hip replacement this past week. They are both in our thoughts and prayers.
