Help to make this next year A FUN and event filled year to involve us all.

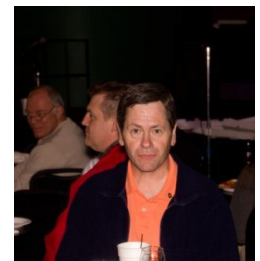

University of Iowa

Seventy two members and guests enjoyed the CSI unit of North Scott Rotary continue to search for the "real" charter. Charlie Jones seems to be the primary suspect. Dr. Cohen gave a very interesting speech with facts and figures about the University of Iowa. 6000 students from Scott County attend U of I. It is the largest overall employer in Iowa. 121 employees are from Scott County. He has served in a variety of positions with the University of Southern California, University of Kentucky and the University of Iowa. His main interests are leadership issues in the health care delivery and health professions.

University of Iowa contributes six billion dollars to the economy of Iowa. One in every 30 jobs in Iowa is associated with the University. It has a huge economic impact on the state.

Numerous donations were made on Friday to the education fund. Charlie Jones gave \$100 to get the fund over \$135,000. Jeff Helms gave \$50 because he won the 2010 presidential award from Ford. Lorraine Lynch gave \$2000 in honor of Gary's birthday. Bill Tubbs gave \$100 to celebrate his being named one of the Golden Dozen in the worldwide Golden Quill contest. Linda Frederiksen gave \$10 in honor of the move into the new command center.
