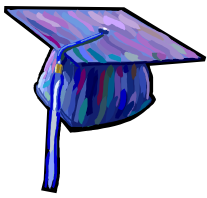

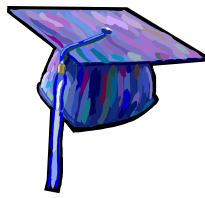

Meeting Notes: May 6, 2011

Merle Anderson: Rotary Volunteer Trip to Uganda, Africa

In October 2010 when North Scott Rotarian Merle Anderson flew to Africa for another one of his many volunteer missions for Rotary, he was never so scared in his life. Although all flights pose a slight risk, seated only 6 seats ahead of Merle was a terrorist. Seems that his suitcase was full of explosives and a cell phone sized detonator. This happened very near to his 67th birthday and Merle is thankful to be here to tell about his experiences.

Merle volunteers through Rotary and CNFA. This organization has been working in East Africa since 2006. They aim to educate the residents in ways to reduce poverty in their own countries. Uganda has a lot of potential according to Merle, but the land is totally covered with bush (scrub trees, weeds, etc.) They have good soil, they just don't know it.

Uganda is about the same size of Oregon in the United States. The population is close to 33 million. The average life expectancy is 49-50 years of age. Malaria is a problem, as well as HIV. Most of the people speak English. Average yearly income is around \$460. A lot of people make much less. They grow their own food and cook everything on charcoal. The whole area is in a haze from the charcoal smoke. They have a lot of goats and

chickens, a few cattle and pigs. Many fruits, maize, sunflowers and beans are also produced.

Some of the industries that Uganda has are refining soybean oil, producing plastic chairs and the oil seeds and grain division. Plastic chairs are seen everywhere in Uganda, even in the restaurants. They export coffee, fish, tea and beans. Residents eat only one meal a day, which primarily consists of beans and whatever fruits they have at the time.

Large termite mounds are a common site in Uganda. The residents really like them because the dirt from these mounds is what they use on the outside of the huts, to keep the materials stuck together.

Fifty five attended on May 6, including 3 visiting Rotarians. Brock Earnhardt and Ralph Heninger from the Davenport club and Josh Carter from the Bettendorf club. May birthdays were celebrated and \$20 in cake money was collected. Charlie kept the business part of the meeting short so Merle would have more time. Pete Wislander was proud to tell of his wife's accomplishments, including a master's degree in science and acute care. He donated \$50 to the education fund. Charlie said to lay down a buck if you thought you would have been fined today, or if you were leaving early. \$28 was collected. Dick Cole presented a flag from the Rotary club he visited in Turkey. He said it was an expensive trip to Rotary, cab fare was \$20 and the meal was \$30. He will tell us more later.
